

## CHAPTER 18.

## AN ACT

(S. B. 68)

Requiring the Governor of the Territory of Alaska to cause to be printed certain reports of Territorial officials.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Report of  
Treasurer,  
Secretary,  
Mining  
Inspector  
Pioneer's  
Home and  
Governor's  
Message to  
be printed.

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the Governor of the Territory of Alaska to cause to be printed the Annual Reports of the Treasurer, Secretary, Mining Inspector and Pioneer Home before the opening of the Legislature on the first Monday of March every second year and to have ready for distribution and distribute among the various members of the Legislature on that day printed copies of such reports. It shall also be the duty of the Governor of the Territory to cause to be printed the Message of the Governor of the Territory and cause the same to be distributed among the several members of the Legislature of the Territory within twenty-four hours after the same is delivered by the Governor or with all possible speed.

## CHAPTER 19.

## AN ACT

(H. B. 42)

To prohibit the sale, exchange or giving of cigarettes, cigars or tobacco in any form to persons under the age of eighteen (18) years in the Territory of Alaska, declaring the violation of this act a misdemeanor and fixing the penalty for such offense.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Sale or gift of  
tobacco to  
persons under  
18 years  
of age  
prohibited.

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful in the Territory of Alaska for any person, firm or corporation to sell, exchange or give any cigarettes, cigars or tobacco in any form to any person under the age of eighteen (18) years.

Section 2. Any person, firm or corporation who shall

violate any of the provisions of this act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) nor more than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for each offense, and upon a second conviction shall be punished by imprisonment in the Federal jail for not less than one month nor more than six months.

## CHAPTER 20

### AN ACT

(H. B. 29)

Amending Section Six Hundred and Fifty-eight, Chapter Twenty-three, Compiled Laws of the Territory of Alaska, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 658, Chapter 23, Compiled Laws of the Territory of Alaska, be amended to read as follows: Amendment  
Sec. 658, Ch.  
23 C. L. A.

“Section 658. “Every such foreign corporation or company shall annually and within sixty days (60), from the first day of January of each year make a report, which shall be in the same form and contain the same information as required in the statement mentioned in Section Six Hundred and Fifty-Four, Chapter Twenty-Three of the Compiled Laws of the Territory of Alaska, which report shall be filed in the office of the Secretary of the Territory of Alaska, and a duplicate thereof in the office of the Clerk of the District Court for the Division of the Territory wherein the business of the corporation is carried on.” Annual

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall take effect on its passage and approval. Emergency.
