

Alaska, 1913, entitled: "An Act to provide for the registration and restriction of communicable diseases in the Territory of Alaska; and declaring an emergency", shall be paid by the Territorial Treasurer from Territorial funds not otherwise appropriated upon vouchers, in duplicate, properly signed and countersigned by the Commissioner of Health, an annual salary of \$200.00 dollars.

That actual traveling expenses be allowed the Commissioner of Health whenever in the exercise of his duties he may be called away from his regular place of business provided all such expenditures shall be authorized by the Governor prior to the date of expenditure.

Section 2. This Act shall take effect and be in full force after its passage and approval by the Governor of the Territory of Alaska. Traveling expenses Commissioner of Health.

CHAPTER 54.

AN ACT

(S. B. 86)

To authorize the Divisional Road Commission of each Road District in Alaska to expend monies appropriated for road purposes in aid of navigation, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That any portion of the monies which have been or hereafter may be appropriated and apportioned to any road division in the Territory of Alaska for the purpose of constructing and maintaining roads, trails, bridges or ferries, may in the discretion of the Divisional Road Commission of such Road District be expended in aid of navigation by dredging the waters of such Division or adjacent thereto. Territorial road funds may be used for dredging waters.

Section 2. An Emergency is hereby declared to exist and this act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.
