

CHAPTER 73.

AN ACT

(H. B. 88)

To make appropriations for the expense of the Territory of Alaska for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1917 and for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1918, and for the quarter ending March 31, 1919, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That the following sums be and are hereby appropriated out of any monies in the Treasury of the Territory of Alaska not otherwise appropriated, for the expense of the Territory for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1917, for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1918 and for the quarter ending March 31, 1919:

(a) ALASKA PIONEERS' HOME: For the period ending March 31, 1919.

For enforcement of Chapter 51, Session  
Laws 1913, entitled: "An act to relieve  
destitution in the Territory of Alaska," to  
be expended under the direction of the  
Governor ..... 15,000.00  
or so much thereof as may be necessary.

(l) EXPENSE OF TERRITORIAL DELEGATES TO  
NATIONAL AND OTHER CONFERENCES:

For actual and necessary travel and subsis-  
tence expenses for delegates appointed

tory at National or other conferences  
whose deliberations relate to subjects of  
importance to the Territory as well as to  
the States, to be expended by the Governor ..... 2,000.00

Provided that no delegate shall receive any  
compensation nor be allowed travel and  
subsistence expenses beyond a period of  
thirty days and that only one delegate  
shall be named to attend a conference and

that no person shall be twice appointed as delegate in any one year.

(m) BOUNTY ON WOLVES:

For payment of bounty on wolves as provided by statute, to be expended under the direction of the Territorial Treasurer for the period ending March 31, 1919 ..... 10,000.00

## CHAPTER 74.

### AN ACT

(H. B. 87)

To amend Sections 1 and 2 of Chapter 76, Laws of Alaska, 1915, entitled 'An Act to establish a system of taxation, create revenue and provide for collection thereof for the Territory of Alaska, and for other purposes; and to amend an Act entitled 'An Act to establish a system of taxation, create revenue and provide for collection thereof for the Territory of Alaska, and for other purposes', approved May 1st, 1913 and declaring an emergency, approved April 29, 1915.

**Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:**

Section 1. That Sections 1 and 2 of Chapter 76 Laws <sup>Amendment.</sup> of Alaska, 1915, approved April 29, 1915, be and the same are hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1. That any person, firm or corporation pro-<sup>License</sup>secuting or attempting to prosecute any of the following<sup>tax pro-</sup> lines of business in the Territory of Alaska shall apply<sup>vided for.</sup>
