

House Concurrent Resolutions

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 1.

WHEREAS the Divine Providence has, in his infinite wisdom, seen fit to remove from his sphere of influence and activity among us, John G. Heid, who was at the time of his death a member of the House of Representatives of the Territorial Legislature of Alaska, and

WHEREAS, it is desired to pay a special and fitting tribute to the memory of Representative Heid, because of his recognized honesty and high integrity, his strong devotion to duty, his many other admirable qualities, and to express our sympathy to his bereaved family; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, that in the death of Representative John G. Heid, the Territory of Alaska has suffered a very great loss; and further

RESOLVED by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring, that in recognition of the valued services rendered his constituents by Representative John G. Heid, appropriate services be held in the Hall of the House of Representatives, Saturday, March 24, 1917, at 2 p. m., and that an opportunity be then given for a tribute to his memory; and further

RESOLVED that a joint committee of two members of the House and two members of the Senate be appointed to arrange for said memorial services; and further

RESOLVED that as a further mark of respect to the memory of the deceased, the Secretary of the House be instructed to set apart one page of the Journal of this day's proceedings, suitably engrossed, for this resolution and to transmit a copy thereof to the family of the deceased.
