
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 2.

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring, That the Printing Committee be instructed to act with the Printing Committee of the Senate to serve as a Joint Committee on Contingent Expenses and Printing.

Adopted by the House March 15, 1917.

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3.

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring, That the Senate Committee on Rules and the House Committee on Rules form a Joint Committee on Rules, for the purpose of adopting joint rules of the Senate and House of Representatives.

Pending the report of said Joint Committee on Rules the joint rules of the 1915 Session shall govern the Senate and House in the transaction of joint business.

Adopted by the House March 15, 1917.

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 4.

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring, That the Committee on Elections, Election Laws and Mileage of the House and Senate, be appointed by the Speaker of the House and the President of the Senate, respectively, to serve as a Joint Committee on Mileage.

Adopted by the House March 15, 1917.

Concurred in by the Senate March 17, 1917.

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 5.

WHEREAS, a state of war exists now between our National Government and Germany, and;

WHEREAS, We feel it is as our most urgent duty to assist our Government in its prosecution of this war,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of Alaska, the Senate concurring, That a joint committee to consist of three members from each body be appointed

by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House, respectively, to serve as a joint committee to consider the most fitting action the Legislature of this Territory can take to assist our Government in this time of National peril. The said Committee shall consult with the Governor as to its course of action.

Adopted by the House, April 18, 1917.

Concurred in by the Senate, April 21, 1917.

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 6.

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, the Senate concurring, That Thos. C. Price, the Representative from the Third Division of Alaska be, and he is hereby permitted to introduce at this time a bill entitled:

"An Act to amend Section 3, Chapter 42 of the Session Laws of Alaska, 1913, entitled 'An Act to provide for the registration and restriction of communicable diseases in the Territory of Alaska and declaring an emergency,' approved April 28, 1913," and numbered "House Bill No. 86."

Adopted by the House April 25, 1917.

Concurred in by the Senate April 28, 1917.

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 7.

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, the Senate concurring, That the Committee having charge of the general appropriation bill be, and the same hereby is, instructed to include in the general appropriation bill such appropriations as may be necessary to compensate the employees of the two houses for extra and additional services performed, such as overtime, etc.

Adopted by the House May 1, 1917.

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 8.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, the Governor concurring, That there is hereby appropriated from any money in the treasury of the Territory not otherwise appropriated the sum of One Hundred and Five Dollars (\$105.00), in payment of salary to Representative Joseph
