

mortgage would otherwise cease to be valid as against creditors of the person making such mortgage or subsequent purchasers or mortgagees in good faith, but the validity of such mortgage may be extended as against such persons for successive additional periods of one year by filing similar affidavits and annexing the same as provided in Section 1 of this Act within thirty days next preceding the time when such mortgage would otherwise cease to be valid

CHAPTER 22.

AN ACT

(S. B. 51)

To amend Chapter 20, Session Laws of Alaska, 1917, amending Section 658, Chapter 23, Compiled Laws of the Territory of Alaska, requiring foreign corporations to file annual reports, and authorizing the Secretary of the Territory to extend the time for filing such reports.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Chapter 20,
Laws 1917,
amended

Section 1. That Chapter 20, Session Laws of Alaska, 1917, amending Section 658, Chapter 23, Compiled Laws of the Territory of Alaska, be amended to read as follows:

corporations—
where filed

“Section 658. Every such foreign corporation or company shall annually and within sixty (60) days, from the first day of January of each year, make a report, which shall be in the same form and contain the same information as required in the statement mentioned in Section six hundred fifty-four (654), Chapter twenty-three (23), of the Compiled Laws of the Territory of Alaska, which report shall be filed in the office of the Secretary of the Territory of Alaska, and a duplicate thereof in the office of the Clerk of

the District Court for the Division of the Territory wherein the business of the corporation is carried on; Provided, that the Secretary of the Territory may grant an extension of sixty (60) days further time within which to make and file such annual report, upon a written request being filed with him by such corporation or company, or some one on its behalf." Secretary of Territory may extend time of filing

CHAPTER 23.

AN ACT

(S. B. 70)

Providing that the Territory shall have a preferred claim against the estates of deceased inmates of the Pioneers' Home.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. The estate of every person who has been or shall have been an inmate of the Pioneers' Home at Sitka, shall be subject to the claim of the Territory of Alaska for the care and maintenance of such inmate and if he left neither a widow nor minor child under 18 years of age, such claim shall be preferred and paid in the same order of payment as is by law provided for expenses of last sickness; otherwise such claim shall be paid as claims of general creditors. Claim against estates of inmates Pioneers' Home

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the Trustees of the Pioneers' Home aforesaid, to prepare and present to the Administrator of the estate of such deceased inmate such claim as is hereby authorized, for allowance, and it shall be the duty of the administrator and Probate Court, to allow the same or so much thereof as they find to be correct, and pay the same in the order of payment of claims prescribed herein, and the amount paid thereon shall be turned into the Territorial Treasury to the credit of the fund for the maintenance of the Home. Trustees to file claim with administrator
