CHAPTER 37.

AN ACT

(S. B. 66)

Prescribing certain duties to be performed by the Attorney General of the Territory of Alaska.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska :

Attorney General to correspond relative to defects in laws

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the Attorney General of the Territory of Alaska, in addition to the duties heretofore imposed upon him by law, to correspond at

least quarter-yearly with each of the Federal Judges, the United States District Attorneys, the Presidents of the different bar associations and with such United States Commissioners, attorneys, town councils, Chambers of Commerce and Civic Bodies as he shall deem proper in the Territory for the purpose of obtaining their suggestions and recommendations upon the following subjects:

First: What new and needful law or laws should be enacted by the Territorial Legislature.

Second: What discrepancies, inconsistencies, ambiguities and conflicts, in existing laws governing the Territory of Alaska, and how they should be remedied.

Third: What laws now existing on the statute books of the Territory are inapplicable, or inimicable to the best interests of the Territory of Alaska, and should be repealed.

The said Attorney General shall file all communications he receives on the subject above referred to and make the same a part of the permanent files of his office, so that ready reference to the same can be had by any member of the Territorial Legislature.

Section 3. The Attorney General shall prepare, draft and have ready to submit to the Chairman of the Judiciary Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives of the Legislature of the Territory for each session such new laws as in his opinion should be enacted by the Territorial Legislature of Alaska; such laws as are necessary to cure the defects, irregularities, discrepancies or inconsistencies in existing laws, as well as for the repeal of such laws as now are in force which are inapplicable, or inimicable to the best interests of the Territory of Alaska.
