

porations or associations authorized to do business in the Territory, at the time of the passage of this Act, may, on or before the first of July, 1919, comply with the provisions hereof and thereupon all its acts and contracts done and made before this Act goes into effect shall be valid and shall be deemed to have been done by a duly authorized agent.

Conflicting acts
repealed

Chapter 39 of the Session Laws of Alaska, 1917, and Chapter 57 of the Session Laws of Alaska, 1915, and all other Acts or parts of Acts in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.

Emergency

Section 32. An emergency is hereby declared and this Act shall take effect upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 47.

AN ACT

(S. B. 45)

To amend Section 8, 13, and 20 of Chapter 37 of Session Laws of Alaska, 1913, entitled: "An Act to regulate the practice of pharmacy in the Territory of Alaska and to prescribe penalties for the violation thereof."

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 8, Chap-
ter 37, Laws of
1917, amended

Section 1. That Section 8 of Chapter 37 of the Session Laws of Alaska, 1913, entitled: "An Act to regulate the practice of pharmacy in the Territory of Alaska and to prescribe penalties for the violation thereof," be, and the same is hereby, amended to read as follows:

Board of Pharm-
acy to elect
president and
secretary

"Section 8. The Territorial Board of Pharmacy shall elect a president and a secretary from the number of its own members, who shall be elected for the term of two years, and until their successors are elected, and who shall perform the duties prescribed by the board.

Duties of board

It shall be the duty of the board to examine all

applicants for registration submitting blanks in proper form; to grant certificate of registration to such persons as may be entitled to the same under the provisions of this act; to cause prosecution of all persons violating the provisions of this act; to report annually to the Governor upon the condition of pharmacy in the Territory which said report shall furnish a record of the proceedings of said board for the year as well as the names of all persons registered under this act; and also an itemized account of all moneys received and disbursed by them as said board.

Minutes of board

The board shall hold meetings for the examination of applicants for registration and the transaction of such other business as shall pertain to its duties at least once in twelve months, Provided, that the president of the board of pharmacy may call special meetings of said board not more than twice in any one year for the purpose of transacting such business as may properly come before it, and said board shall give thirty days' public notice of the time and place of all its meetings.

The said board shall have power to make such by-laws, rules, and regulations not inconsistent with the laws of the Territory, as may be necessary to carry into effect the provisions of this act.

May make rules and regulations

The board shall have power to investigate all alleged violations of the provisions of this act, regulating the dispensing or sale of drugs, medicines or poisons, or the practice of pharmacy, which may come to its notice, and whenever there appears reasonable cause therefor to take and hear testimony with reference to the same.

To investigate violations of act

The board shall keep a book of registration in which shall be entered the names and place of business of persons registered under this act, together with a record of the conditions justifying such registration. Two members of said board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of all business that may properly come before the board."

To enter names of registered pharmacists in register

Section 2. That Section 13 of said Chapter 37 be amended to read as follows:

Registered pharmacist to be employed when employer not registered

"Section 13. Any person not a registered pharmacist and not having in his employ a registered pharmacist within the full meaning of this act, who shall retail, compound, or dispense medicines, or who shall take, use or exhibit the title of registered pharmacist, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in any sum not to exceed Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars.

A pharmacy defined

Every place in which physicians' prescriptions are compounded shall be deemed to be a pharmacy, or a drug store and the same shall be under the personal supervision of a registered pharmacist.

Certain acts forbidden—penalty

Any person who shall permit the compounding and dispensing of prescriptions, or vending of drugs, medicines or poisons in his store or place of business, except under the supervision of a registered pharmacist; or any registered pharmacist, registered under this act, while continuing in business, who shall neglect to procure annually his renewal of registration, or any person who shall wilfully make any false representation to procure registration for himself or any other person, or who shall violate any of the provisions of this act wilfully and knowingly, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not to exceed Two hundred dollars; Provided, that nothing in this act shall operate in any manner to interfere with business of any physician in regular practice, or prevent him from supplying to his patients such medicines as he may deem proper. Also provided further: General stores and roadhouses outside a radius of three miles from any drug store shall be permitted to handle and sell such non-poisonous patent medicines, remedies for horses and dogs and household remedies and surgical dressings in original unbroken packages properly and distinctly labeled, as the board of pharmacy shall permit.

When stores may sell patent medicines

They shall not be permitted to dispense poisons and chemicals except the following: carbolic acid, cyanide of potash, laudanum, aconite and strychnine in original unbroken packages, properly and distinctly labeled.

Stores forbidden to dispense poisons—except

Hospitals and charitable institutions shall, however, be permitted to dispense medicines for their own use under the supervision of the attending licensed physician."

Hospitals may dispense medicine under supervision

Section 3. That Section 20 of said Chapter 37 be amended to read as follows:

"Section 20. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this act and for which a penalty is not herein provided for shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in any sum not exceeding Three hundred dollars, or may be imprisoned in jail not exceeding three months, and it shall be the duty of the respective district attorneys to prosecute all violations of this act in the manner as other violations of law.

CHAPTER 48.

AN ACT

(S. B. 44)

To authorize the organization, operation, management and supervision of Marine Insurance Corporations in the Territory of Alaska, to take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That pursuant to the provisions of this Act, five or more natural persons of full age, two-thirds of whom are bona fide residents of the Territory of Alaska, may unite to form a stock corporation, the chief business of which shall be in the Territory of Alaska and the principal business of the corpora-
