SENATE MEMORIAL NO. 1

TO THE HONORABLE J. M. TANNER, UNITED STATES
MARSHAL FOR THE FIRST JUDICIAL DIVISION OF
ALASKA:

SIR:

Your memorialists, the Senate of the Territorial Legislature of Alaska, most respectfully represent that,

WHEREAS; It has come to our notice that during the past year several insane persons have been placed upon the pier at the town of Hoonah, and left to be cared for by residents of this town, and

WHEREAS; There is not at present an officer of the law at Hoonah to take charge of cases of this kind and there is no provision of law whereby those who should be responsible for bringing these cases to ports where officers of the law are located can be compelled to do so, and

WHEREAS; The residents of Hoonah are entitled to be protected in the circumstances herein mentioned,

NOW THEREFORE; Be it resolved, that the members of the Alaska Senate urgently request the Honorable Marshal to assign a deputy marshal to duty at Hoonah, during the cannery season and for the entire year, if possible, and your memorialists will ever pray.
