### SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 1

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate, that the Secretary be requested and he is hereby authorized to forward by the United States mail a copy of all bills, memorials and resolutions, that are printed and distributed to the members of the Senate, to the Clerk of the Court for each Judicial Division of the Territory of Alaska and the "Law Librarian" University of Washington, Seattle, Washington.

Adopted by the Senate March 7, 1919.

### SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 2

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate, that no bill introduced in the Senate after the forty-fifth day shall receive consideration except by unanimous consent of the Senate.

Passed the Senate April 11, 1919.

### SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 3

WHEREAS, the Senate has heard with great sorrow of the untimely death of CHARLES A. SULZER, a former member of this Legislative body, and

WHEREAS, it is desired that a special and fitting tribute be paid to the memory of the departed Senator, and that the sympathy of this body be extended to the bereaved family.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Territory of Alaska that this body do now adjourn, and that prior to such adjournment the President of the Senate appoint a Committee of three members, to consult with such Committee as the House may appoint for this purpose, to arrange for appropriate services, and to draft suitable resolutions.

### SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 4 IN MEMORIAM

WHEREAS, the Divine Providence has, in his infinite wisdom, seen fit to remove from his sphere of influence and activ-

ities among us, our Delegate to Congress and former member of the Alaska Territorial Senate, Charles A. Sulzer, and

WHEREAS, it is desired to pay a special and fitting tribute to his memory, in recognition of his commanding ability, irreprouachable honesty and integrity, his devotion to duty, his labors for the welfare of his fellowmen, his untiring efforts on behalf of our Territory, which he sincerely loved, and because of his unselfish friendship, his love for his family and of his many other admirable qualities, and for the purpose of expressing our sympathy to his sorrowing wife and family; therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, that in the death of Charles A. Sulzer, the Territory of Alaska, has suffered a great loss and every member of this Legislature has lost a sincere supporter of honest and progressive work for our Territory: and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Senate, that in recognition of the valued services rendered our Territory by Charles A. Sulzer, appropriate services be held in the hall of the House of Representatives Saturday, April 19, 1919, at 2 p. m., and that an opportunity be given for a tribute to his memory; and that a Committee of two members of the Senate be appointed to arrange for said Memorial services; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that as a mark of respect to the memory of the deceased, the Secretary of the Senate be instructed to set apart one page of the Journal of this days proceedings, for this resolution and to transmit a copy thereof, suitably engrossed, to the family of our deceased friend and associate.
