

CHAPTER 11.

AN ACT

[S. B. 69]

To allow electors of the Territory of Alaska to indicate their preference for the person who shall be appointed Governor of the Territory.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. At the primary election and at the general election in the year nineteen hundred and twenty-four, and every four years thereafter, the electors of the Territory shall express by ballot their choice of the person to be appointed Governor of the Territory of Alaska.

Electors to express choice for Governor, and when.

Section 2. The names of persons desiring the approval of the electors of the Territory for their candidacy for appointment as Governor shall be printed at the head of the official ballot at the primary and at the general election under the heading

Names of candidates for appointment to be in ballot.

“FOR GOVERNOR OF ALASKA”

(vote for one)

and the laws governing primary and general elections shall apply in all respects to the nomination and selection of persons for Governor.

Section 3. The Secretary of the Territory of Alaska shall on the 4th day of March following the election certify the result of such election to the President of the United States and the person receiving the highest number of votes for Governor shall be the choice of the People of the Territory for that office and shall be recommended to the President for appointment.

Vote to be canvassed and recommended to President.
