

CHAPTER 12.

AN ACT

[H. B. 23]

To authorize the purchase of the Neuman collection of Eskimo antiquities, and to appropriate the money therefor.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. The Governor of the Territory is hereby authorized to purchase from Daniel S. Neuman, for the use and benefit of the Territory, the collection of Eskimo antiquities known as the Neuman collection and now on exhibition in the quarters of the Alaska Historical Society in the Arctic Brotherhood Building at Juneau, Alaska, and to pay for the same a sum not to exceed fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000); and the sum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000), or so much thereof as may be needed for said purpose is hereby appropriated out of moneys not otherwise appropriated.

CHAPTER 13.

AN ACT

[S. B. 53]

To authorize incorporated towns and cities in the Territory of Alaska to succeed to the property and rights of school districts organized under the provisions of Chapter 5 of the 1917 Session Laws of Alaska, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That whenever any town, village or settlement that is incorporated as a school district under the provisions of Chapter 5 of the 1917 Session Laws of the Territory of Alaska shall incorporate as a city or

town under the provisions of the Laws of the Territory of Alaska and shall organize a school district as provided in Section 627 of said chapter, such municipality and school district so organized shall succeed to all the property and rights of such district organized under the provisions of said Chapter 5 of the 1917 Session Laws of Alaska.

Incorporated towns to succeed to property and rights of School Districts.

Section 2. That upon the incorporation of such town, village or settlement, as a city or town, and the organization of the school district therein, and the election of its officers, all power and authority of the officers of the school district organized under the provisions of said Chapter 5 of the 1917 Session Laws of Alaska shall cease and be at an end and all real estate, funds, books and other property of said district in the possession of the officers thereof or of any of them, shall become the property of such municipality and the School Board of such school district is authorized and required to transfer all such property to the said municipality, and the municipality may collect any unpaid taxes levied by said incorporated school district, issue tax deeds and certificates of redemption and may proceed in the manner and under the provisions of law prescribed by said Chapter 5 of the 1917 Session Laws of Alaska, for the purpose of winding up all the business of such organized school district.

Property to be transferred.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and the above Act shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.
