Repeal of former acts.

Section 22. Chapter 11 Session Laws of 1913 relating to the fees and licenses to be paid by foreign and domestic corporations, as amended by Chapter 54 Session Laws of 1915 and by Chapter 72 Session Laws of 1915 is hereby repealed.

## CHAPTER 23.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 37]

Requiring the filing of inventories of property belonging to the Territory, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Officers to file inventory of office fixtures.

Section 1. Within thirty days after the passage and approval of this Act every officer of the Territory of Alaska who has in his possession or under his control any books, office furniture, fixtures, equipment or other property of a permanent character belonging to the Territory, shall prepare an inventory of such property and shall file such inventory in the office of the Treasurer, except that the inventory of the Treasurer's office shall be filed in the office of the Secretary of the Territory. Whenever property of a permanent nature is purchased for or otherwise acquired for any office, such property shall be added to the inventory by the Treasurer at the time the voucher for such property is paid.

Inventory to be made biennially.

Section 2. Whenever an officer of the Territory enters upon the duties of his office he shall file a new inventory and he shall also file a new inventory for each biennium on the first day of January in each odd numbered year.

Section 3. Whenever any officer of the Territory vacates his office, he shall secure from his successor in office, or from whosoever shall be entitled to possession of the property belonging to the office, a receipt for all such property, and shall file such receipt in the office where the inventory is on file; and it shall be the duty of the Treasurer to withhold from every officer about to vacate his office, the salary of such officer for the last month of his service, until such receipt shall have been filed, and if any property belonging to the office is not so receipted for, the value thereof shall be deducted from the salary of the retiring officer.

To secure receipt from successor in office, etc.

Section 4. Whenever property of a permanent nature is sold or otherwise disposed of the proceeds thereof shall be paid the treasurer and proper notation made upon the inventory.

Notation of property sold to be made.

Section 5. The provisions of this act shall apply to all officers, boards, commissions and others, who have under their control or in their possession property belonging to the Territory.

Provisions herein to apply to all Territorial officers.

Section 6. The Governor may promulgate rules and regulations for carrying out the provisions of this act.

Governor to make regulations.

Section 7. That an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this act shall take effect upon and after its passage and approval.
