Section 10. The provisions of this act shall apply, as nearly as practicable, to all property or assets heretofore escheated to the Territory, and to all property or funds heretofore delivered to a Clerk of Court or the Treasurer of the Territory by order of any probate court as escheated property, and such property, heretofore so delivered to the Treasurer, may be by him sold or otherwise disposed of under the provisions of this act, and shall be held by him subject to the rights of any legal heir under the provisions of Section 7 of this act.

Section 11. Sections 608, 609, 610, 611, 612, 613, 614 and 615 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska, and Chapter 73 of the Session Laws of 1913, are hereby repealed.

Section 12. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

## CHAPTER 41.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 59]

Providing for a commission to collect exhibits for the National Exposition of Mines to be held in Chicago, Illinois, Oct. 17, to Oct. 22, 1921, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That there be, and is hereby created, a Commission consisting of the Governor and four other members, one from each Judicial Division of the Ter-

ritory, to be selected and appointed by the Governor of the Territory, to collect, classify and ship to the National Exposition of Mines, to be held under the auspices of the American Mining Congress in Chicago, Illinois on October 17 to October 22, 1921, and to other expositions, national in their scope, such ores, minerals, specimens, products, manufactured or otherwise, as may be best adapted to show the resources and possibilities of mining, and other industries, of the Territory of Alaska.

Commission/ to collect exhibits, how appointed.

Section 2. The Governor shall be chairman and managing director of said board and the several members of said board, within the respective judicial divisions from which they are appointed, are authorized, under the direction and supervision of the Governor, to choose and select such exhibits as may be received from any commercial body within their respective districts in the Territory, [or] collections representative of the resources of his particular district which may be of interest, or inform the public, or those interested in mines, mining development, and other industries peculiar to the Territory of the progress and development of the same.

Governor to be Chairman of Commission.

Section 3. The members of said commission shall serve without pay, but in the discretion of the Governor of the Territory they may be allowed actual expenses in preparing specimens for shipment, and the said members of such commission, subject to the approval of the Governor of the Territory, may, and they are authorized within their respective districts to appoint such assistants as they may deem necessary to aid and assist in the collection of such exhibits, but such assistants shall receive no compensation of any nature whatsoever, therefor.

Commission to serve without compensation.

May appoint assistants.

Section 4. All exhibits collected and shipped to any national exposition shall become the property of the

Territory and shall be returned to the Historical Museum at the Capitol and shall be available for exhibit therein, or at any other exposition as may best advertise the resources of Alaska unless at the time of delivery to the Commission a demand for their return shall have been made.

Governor to  
regulate  
disbursements.

Section 5. All appropriations which may be made to carry out the provisions of this Act shall be disbursed under such regulations as the Governor shall prescribe.

Emergency.

Section 6. That inasmuch as said exhibit is to be held in October and time is of importance, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

## CHAPTER 42.

### AN ACT

[H. B. 31]

To impose a license tax on the business of fur-farming, trapping and trading in pelts and skins of fur-bearing animals, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

License tax to  
be issued by  
Commissioner.

Amount of tax.

Section 1. No person shall engage in the business of fur-farming or of buying or dealing in furs without first securing from the Commissioner and Ex-officio Recorder a license so to do. The license fee for each license shall be ten dollars (\$10) for the business of fur-farming, twenty-five dollars (\$25) for stationary fur-buyers, and one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150) for itinerant fur-buyers, which fee shall be paid to the Commissioner before the license is issued.
