

death of such Pioneer, the Governor or his accredited representative may reduce such property to money, by sale or otherwise, and cover such money into the treasury of the Territory of Alaska; PROVIDED, however, that at any time within six months after the death of such Pioneer any creditor or heir of such deceased may apply for administration of said estate, and in that event the Treasurer of the Territory shall deliver to the administrator of such estate, all the surplus of the funds from said estate covered into the treasury of the Territory over and above the claim of the Territory and the costs of reducing said estate to money.

To reduce property to money, when.

Proviso.

Section 2. This act shall apply as well to property which has been left by such Pioneers who have heretofore died, and who at the time of their demise were inmates of said Pioneers' Home at Sitka, or who received allowance from the Territory pursuant to law.

Provisions apply to Pioneers at Home and those receiving allowances.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this act shall take effect from and after its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 46.

AN ACT

[H. B. 42]

To make appropriations for the expenses of the Territory of Alaska, for the last three-quarters of the fiscal year, 1921, beginning April 1, and ending December 31, for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1922, and for the quarter ending March 31, 1923, and for the school year ending June 30, 1923, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. The following sums, or so much thereof as shall severally be found necessary, are hereby ap-

appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury of the Territory of Alaska not otherwise appropriated, for the expenses of the Territory, for the last three-quarters of the fiscal year, 1921, beginning April 1 and ending December 31, for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1922, and for the quarter ending March 31, 1923, except that the appropriation herein made for support of schools in incorporated towns, and incorporated school districts as well as for support of schools outside of incorporated towns or incorporated school districts shall be used for expenses during the period from July first, 1921, to June 30th, 1923.

CHAPTER 47.

AN ACT

[S. B. 52]

To provide for the alteration of the boundaries of Incorporated cities, towns and villages and repealing Chapter 76 Session Laws of 1913 relating to the annexation of territory to incorporated towns, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Any territory within the corporate limits of any city, town or village may be excluded there-
