

CHAPTER 9.

AN ACT

[H. B. 30]

To provide for an expression by the female electors of the Territory of Alaska of their desire for the enactment of a law imposing upon them the same duty to serve as jurors as is now imposed on men.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. There shall be submitted to the female electors of the Territory at the next general election the question whether or not they are in favor of a law requiring women to serve as jurors.

Question of jury duty for women submitted to female electors.

Section 2. At such election there shall be printed a separate ballot which shall be distributed to female electors only, on which ballot shall be printed:

- For a law requiring women to serve as jurors.
- Against a law requiring women to serve as jurors.

Separate ballot to female electors.

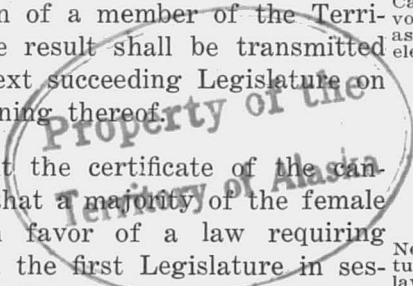
Note: Place a cross (X) opposite your choice.

Section 3. The canvassing of such vote shall be performed in the same manner as the canvassing of the returns of the election of a member of the Territorial Legislature, and the result shall be transmitted by the Governor to the next succeeding Legislature on the first day of the convening thereof.

Canvassing of vote to be same as Legislative elections.

Section 4. In the event the certificate of the canvassing board shall show that a majority of the female electors have declared in favor of a law requiring women to serve as jurors, the first Legislature in session after such election shall pass an act appropriately expressing the wish of said electors.

Next Legislature to enact law accordingly.



[Note:—The foregoing Chapter was returned by the Governor to the House of Representatives on May 2, 1921, with his veto and on May 3, 1921 the House by a vote of 11 ayes and 5 nays

on reconsideration passed the same and on May 4th the Senate by a vote of 7 ayes and 1 nay, on reconsideration passed the same, the objections of the Governor to the contrary notwithstanding.]

## CHAPTER 10.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 24]

Repealing Chapter 32 of the Session Laws of Alaska, 1919, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Repeal of Act.

Section 1. That Chapter 32 of the Session Laws of 1919, being "An Act authorizing the Territory of Alaska and incorporated cities therein, to engage in maritime and river commerce; creating the Alaska Territorial Shipping Board and office of Territorial Shipping Commissioner, prescribing their powers and duties; defining the duties of the Governor and Attorney General of Alaska hereunder; providing for compensation of officers and employees of said Board, making an appropriation for the purpose thereof, and declaring an emergency", be, and the same is, hereby repealed.

Board to account for property.

Section 2. That said board shall render an account to the Territory of all office equipment and any property of value whatsoever purchased under and by authority of said Act.

Emergency.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

[Note:—The foregoing Act was submitted to the Governor on April 29, 1921, and became a law without his approval, by virtue of Section 14 of the Organic Act of Territory.]
