
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3.

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring, that the Senate Committee on Rules and the House Committee on Rules form a Joint Committee on Rules, for the purpose of adopting joint rules of the Senate and House of Representatives.

Pending the report of said Joint Committee on Rules the joint rules of the 1919 session shall govern the Senate and the House in the transaction of joint business.

Adopted by the House, March 10, 1921.

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 4.

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Alaska Territorial Legislature, the Senate concurring, that the Speaker of the House and the President of the Senate appoint a committee of two members each to confer with the Governor of the Territory of Alaska relative to securing O. B. privileges in the use of the government cable and telegraph lines in Alaska by the members of the Territorial Legislature while in session.

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 5.

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring, that the Commissioner of Education be, and he is hereby, instructed to call for bids for the printing of 2,000 copies of the Report of the Commissioner of Education.

That, under the joint direction of the Finance Committee of the Senate and the Printing and Purchasing Committee of the House, he award the contract for such printing to the lowest and best bidder, and that he have general supervision of the printing and proof reading.
