SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 1.

TO THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE AND VICE-PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA:

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska in the Fifth biennial session assembled, desires to take this opportunity of conveying its official greetings to the nation's President and Vice-President, on the occasion of their inauguration, and

WHEREAS, the members of the Territorial Legislature of Alaska wish to convey to Warren G. Harding of Ohio and Calvin Coolidge of Massachusetts an expression of its loyalty, devotion and support to the principles, as proclaimed for the conduct of affairs of the nation during the ensuing administration.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it resolved by the Senate, the House concurring, that it is with fullest confidence in the integrity, ability and broad vision of Warren G. Harding, President, and Calvin Coolidge, Vice-President, this tender of support, sympathy and understanding is extended, and that as Americans and fellow countrymen, who without the privilege of national suffrage, by reason of being residents of a Territory, we take this means of wishing you a long and successful administration, which will heal the scars of war and hasten the arrival of peace and prosperity throughout our great nation.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 2.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, that the Senate Committee on Judiciary and Federal Relations, be authorized to employ a clerk at an expenditure not to exceed Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00).
