

or one-sixth grain cocaine, or one-sixth grain eucaine, or one-sixth grain nova-caine, or one-sixth grain beta-eucaine, or ten grains chloral hydrate in one fluid ounce, or if a solid preparation, in one avoirdupois ounce; and further provided, that the above provisions shall not apply to the sale or compounding of remedies used for veterinary purposes and liniments. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Act shall upon conviction be punished as follows, viz: For the first offense by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100) and not more than two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250), or by imprisonment for not more than one hundred days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; for the second offense, by a fine of not less than two hundred dollars (\$200) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500), or by imprisonment for not more than two hundred days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; and for the third offense, by imprisonment in a penitentiary for not less than one year nor more than five years.

Penalty.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of each member of the Board of Pharmacy to see that the provisions of the foregoing section are enforced, to investigate all reports of violations of said section, and to prosecute all violations of said section which may come to his notice.

## CHAPTER 18.

### AN ACT

[H. B. 13]

To amend Section 6, Chapter 8, of the Session Laws of Alaska, 1917, relating to the Board of Medical Examiners of Alaska.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 6, Chapter 8, of the Session Laws of Alaska 1917, entitled, "An Act to regu-

late the practice of medicine and surgery in the Territory of Alaska, to create a Board of Medical Examiners, to provide for the punishment of violators of the provisions of this Act by fine or imprisonment, and to repeal all laws in conflict with this Act," be amended to read as follows:

Amendment.

Section 6. The fee for such examination shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00), and shall be paid by the applicant to the Secretary-Treasurer of said Board at the time of making application for examination. The said fee is returnable only in case the applicant is unavoidably prevented from taking the said examination. The fee for a license issued through reciprocity with another state shall be one hundred dollars (\$100.00), which amount shall be paid to the Treasurer of the Territory; also all fees for licenses hereafter collected by said Board of Medical Examiners be likewise paid to the Territorial Treasury.

## CHAPTER 19.

### AN ACT

[H. B. 22]

To amend Chapter 29 of the Laws of 1919 relative to the imposition and collection of poll tax for school purposes.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Section 2 of Chapter 29 of the Laws of 1919 is amended by adding thereto the following:

"The common council and the school boards aforesaid shall secure from each tax collector so appointed a bond in favor of the Territory of Alaska, in a sum equal to the amount of the tax estimated to be collectible by each such collector, which bond shall be approved by such common council or school board and

shall be conditioned that the collector will faithfully perform his duties and account for all moneys by him collected, as provided by law, and which bond, when so executed and approved, shall be immediately transmitted to the Treasurer of the Territory."

Section 2. Section 10 of Chapter 29 of the Laws of 1919 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 10. The Treasurer of the Territory of Alaska shall, before the first Monday in the month of April in each year deliver to the Clerk of each incorporated city and to the clerk of each school board in the school districts outside incorporated cities, blank tax receipts, in book form, with stubs numbered the same as the receipts, of one hundred (100) in each book and in sufficient number for each school district and city, and who shall deliver such receipt books to the tax collector within their respective districts and take his receipt therefor, which receipt shall be promptly transmitted to the Treasurer of the Territory. The unused receipts, together with the stubs of the used receipts, shall be returned to the Treasurer of the Territory by each tax collector before the thirty-first day of December in the year in which they were delivered. It shall be presumed that the tax collector has collected a tax for each receipt not so returned."

## CHAPTER 20.

### AN ACT

[H. B. 28]

To amend Section 1925, Compiled Laws of Alaska relating to the alteration of earmarks or buttons and brands on animals.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 1925 of the Compiled Laws of Alaska be amended so as to read as follows:
