

“No pension shall be awarded unless the beneficiary shall have made and filed with the Board of Children’s Guardians a sworn statement of facts showing that she is entitled to the pension.”

Affidavit of beneficiary required.

“The Board of Children’s Guardians shall keep a correct record of all proceedings and transactions.”

Records to be kept.

CHAPTER 45.

AN ACT

[H. B. 18]

To amend Section 1, of Chapter 39, of the Session Laws of 1919, relative to Primary Elections.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Amend Paragraph 2, Section 1, Chapter 39, Session Laws of 1919, to read as follows:

“Each person desiring to become a candidate for any of the offices above enumerated shall, on or before the first Tuesday in February before the date of the primary election at which such nominations are to be made, file a declaration of candidacy in the following form:

Time for filing Declaration of Candidacy.

DECLARATION OF CANDIDACY

I, _____, do hereby declare that I reside in the Town (or Precinct) of _____, Territory of Alaska, Judicial Division No. _____, and am a qualified elector therein; I am a member of the _____ party and intend to vote for a majority of the candidates of such party at the coming election.

Declaration of Candidacy, form of.

I hereby declare myself a candidate for nomination to the office of _____ to be made at the primary election to be held on the last Tuesday

in April in the year 19....., and hereby request that my name be printed upon the official primary ballot, as provided by law, as a candidate of the party.

I further declare that, if nominated and elected, I will qualify as and that I will support and abide by the principles enumerated by the party in its national platform and in its platform in this Territory adopted during the present year.

I accompany herewith the sum of \$....., the fee required by law of me for becoming such candidate.

CHAPTER 46.

AN ACT

[H. B. 1]

To provide allowances for certain aged residents of Alaska, and for other purposes, and repealing all acts or parts of acts in conflict herewith.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Any resident of Alaska who has attained the age of sixty-five (65) years or, if a woman, the age of sixty (60) years, and who shall have resided in Alaska for fifteen (15) consecutive years or more immediately prior to making application for receiving the benefits of this act and is entitled to the benefits of the Alaska Pioneers' Home, may, in lieu of an application to be received and cared for at such home, make an application to the Board of Trustees of said Alaska
