business shall be in the Territory of Alaska,' and every foreign corporation organized under the laws of the United States, or the laws of any State or Territory of the United States, other than the Territory of Alaska, or under the laws of any foreign country, for the same purposes for which domestic corporations are organized under Chapter 12 Alaska Session Laws 1913, which shall engage in or do business in the Territory of Alaska, shall pay to the Secretary of Alaska for the use of the Territory for filing Articles of Incorporation a fee of Five (\$5.00) Dollars, and for filing Amended Articles of Incorporation, a fee of Two Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$2.50)."

CHAPTER 52.

AN ACT

[S. B. 67]

To amend Section 13 of Chapter 37 of the Session Laws of Alaska 1913, the same being an act entitled, "An Act to regulate the practice of pharmacy in the Territory of Alaska and to prescribe penalties for the violation thereof. The registering of persons eligible to compound prescriptions; to regulate the sale of poisons, and to establish a board to be known as the Alaska Territorial Board of Pharmacy, appointed by the Governor, and defining the duties of said Board," as amended by the provisions of Chapter 47 of the Session Laws of Alaska 1919.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 13 of Chapter 37 of the Session Laws of Alaska 1913, the same being an act entitled, "An Act to regulate the practice of pharmacy in the Territory of Alaska and to prescribe penalties for the violation thereof. The registering of persons eligible to compound prescriptions; to regulate the sale of poisons, and to establish a board to be known as the Alaska Territorial Board of Pharmacy, appointed by the Governor,

and defining the duties of said Board," as amended by the provisions of Chapter 47 of the Session Laws of Alaska 1919, the same being an Act entitled, "An Act to amend Section 8, 13 and 20 of Chapter 37 of the Session Laws of Alaska 1913, entitled, 'An Act to regulate the practice of pharmacy in the Territory of Alaska and to prescribe penalties for the violation thereof,'" be and the same hereby is amended to read as follows:

"Section 13. Any person not a registered pharmacist and not having in his employ a registered pharmacist within the full meaning of this act, who shall retail, compound or dispense medicines, or who shall take, use or exhibit the title of registered pharmacist, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in a sum not to exceed Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars.

Registered pharmacist to be employed where owner not registered.

"Every place in which physicians' prescriptions are compounded shall be deemed to be a pharmacy, or a drug store and the same shall be under the personal supervision of a registered pharmacist.

A pharmacy defined.

"Any person who shall permit the compounding and dispensing of prescriptions, or vending of drugs, medicines or poisons in his store or place of business, except under the supervision of a registered pharmacist; (or any registered pharmacist), registered under this act, while continuing in business, who shall neglect to procure annually his renewal of registration, or any person who shall wilfully make any false representation to procure registration for himself or any other person, or who shall violate any of the provisions of this act wilfully and knowingly, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not to exceed Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars; Provided, that nothing in this act shall operate in any manner to interfere with business of any physician in regular practice, or prevent him from supplying to his patients such medicines as he may deem proper. Also provided further: That stores and roadhouses out-

Certain acts forbidden—penalty.

When other stores may sell medicines.

side a radius of three miles from any drug store shall be permitted to handle and sell such non-poisonous patent medicines, remedies for horses and dogs and household remedies and surgical dressings properly and distinctly labeled, as the Board of Pharmacy shall permit.

Stores forbidden to dispense poisons, except—

“They shall not be permitted to dispense poisons and chemicals except the following: carbolic acid, cyanide of potash, laudanum and aconite, and such other drugs and medicines as the Board of Pharmacy may permit, properly and distinctly labeled.

Hospitals may dispense medicines under supervision.

“Hospitals and charitable institutions shall, however, be permitted to dispense medicines for their own use under the supervision of the attending licensed physician.”

CHAPTER 53.

AN ACT

[S. B. 5]

To provide liens for persons furnishing labor or material in fisheries, and in manufacture of products of fish and aquatic animals.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Who are lienors and what property subject to lien.

Section 1. Any person, or his assigns, who contributes to the preparation of fish or aquatic animals for food, fish meal, fertilizer, oil or other article of commerce, by furnishing material and labor, or either, therefor, shall have a lien upon the product or output of the cannery, saltery or other plant or establishment for which such material or labor was furnished, as well as upon such plant or establishment itself including the houses, wharves, machinery and equipment thereunto belonging, for the value of such labor and material,
