

stated whenever the City Council of the City of Haines shall have appropriated for the erection of a school building in said city a sum of not less than two thousand (\$2,000) dollars. When such appropriation is made by the said City Council of Haines the Commissioner of Education shall add to such appropriation an equal amount from the appropriation made by this Act, and the same shall be the case as to any further appropriations made by said City of Haines up to a total of \$3500.00, so that when the school house is completed one-half of its cost shall have been paid by the City of Haines and the other half shall have been paid by the Territory of Alaska.

When available and under what conditions.

Section 4. The school building so to be erected shall at all times be available for the education of children who reside at Chilkoot Barracks.

CHAPTER 85.

AN ACT

[H. B. 41]

To regulate the operation of Motor Vehicles upon the public highway outside of incorporated cities within the Territory of Alaska and providing for a penalty for the violation of its provisions.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful to operate upon any highway within the Territory of Alaska, any motor vehicle not equipped with a foot brake, emergency brake and horn that can be heard a reasonable distance away; and suitable head lights and tail lights during all the year except during the summer period when there may be no darkness; all of which said appliances must be in good working order and kept up at all times in a state of repair except as to the lights during the above specified summer period when there may be no darkness.

Section 2. All head lights and tail lights must be kept lit at all times after it becomes dark. On approaching any curve or any other place on the highway where the road ahead cannot be distinctly seen, the horn shall be sounded.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful to drive any motor vehicle except a truck upon any of the public highways within the Territory of Alaska, outside of incorporated towns, at a higher rate of speed than at the rate of twenty-five (25) miles per hour, and it shall be unlawful to drive motor trucks upon any of such highways at a higher rate of speed than at the rate of twenty (20) miles per hour for trucks of one ton or less capacity and fifteen (15) miles per hour for trucks over one ton capacity. It shall be unlawful to drive any kind of a motor vehicle whatsoever around any curve or pass any other vehicle going in an opposite direction at a higher rate of speed than twelve (12) miles per hour, and at any point on a highway where the road cannot be distinctly seen for a distance of at least one hundred yards ahead, it shall be considered a curve within the meaning of this Act as well as all other bends in such highways.

Section 4. This Act shall not be so construed as to prevent municipal corporations from regulating the use of streets within the municipality by motor vehicles, but the power to so do is hereby expressly reserved for and conferred upon all municipal corporations within the Territory.

Section 5. It shall be unlawful to operate any motor vehicle upon any of the public highways of the Territory of Alaska, outside of incorporated cities in violation of any of the provisions herein contained. And any person operating a motor vehicle not equipped as herein specified in any particular, or operating such vehicle without following the provisions hereof, or operating the same at a higher rate of speed than herein specified at the places and under the conditions

herein specified, or in anywise violating any of the provisions of this Act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor against the Territory of Alaska and shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined for the first offense in a sum not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00); for the second offense in a sum not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00), and for the third and subsequent offenses in a sum not more than two hundred dollars (\$200.00) or by imprisonment not more than thirty (30) days in jail, or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

CHAPTER 86.
AN ACT

[H. B. 58]

Providing for the purchase of the Tolovana Tram Road for operation as a public tram and highway and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That the Federal Board of Road Commissioners for Alaska, with the consent and approval of the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners, are hereby authorized and empowered to purchase in the name of and for and in behalf of the Territory of Alaska, the Tolovana Tram Road extending from Livinood, Alaska, to Tolovana River, a distance of approximately twelve miles, together with the road bed, rails, switches, spurs, lateral and other side lines, stations, round-houses and rights-of-way, and all realty owned or used by and in connection with the operation of said road; and all or any part of the equipment of said road which in their judgment is deemed advisable to purchase, including motor, freight and passenger cars, and other cars of all and every kind, and tools of
