Section 12. Any person or persons who shall unlawfully make use of words or descriptions to indicate that he or they are in possession of a certificate from the board shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be punishable by a fine of not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars or imprisonment for not more than one month, or both, at the discretion of the court.

Section 13. The Secretary and Treasurer of the board shall each year, within thirty days after January first, render to the Governor of Alaska a report setting out the number of persons examined by the board during the preceding calendar year, the number who received the degree of Certified Public Accountant from the board, the number of those examined who failed to pass such examination, the number of persons re-examined, the number of certificates revoked, and the total amounts received and disbursed by the board. With such report the secretary and treasurer of the board shall transmit, by money order, draft or other form of exchange payable to the treasurer of the Territory of Alaska, all funds in possession of the Board.

## CHAPTER 94.

### AN ACT

[H. B. 54]

To provide for licensing of fishermen in the Territory of Alaska.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

License requir-  
ed to fish.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in fishing in the Territory of Alaska without

first having obtained a license so to do under the provisions of this Act.

Anyone violating the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine of not more than two hundred (\$200) dollars or by imprisonment for not more than thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

Penalty for violation.

Section 2. Licenses to fish in the waters of Alaska shall be issued by the Treasurer of the Territory and by such other persons as shall by the Treasurer be deputized for that purpose.

Treasurer or Deputy to issue license.

The license fee shall be as follows:

- (a) For resident fishermen of all classes \$1.00;
- (b) For non-resident fishermen who during the entire year use only hook and line, including trollers, but not including those who use set lines \$3.00;
- (c) For non-resident fishermen who use gill nets or set lines \$10.00;
- (d) For non-resident fishermen who use seines or set nets \$25.00;

which fee shall be paid before the license is granted or issued and shall accompany the application for license.

The application for license shall be addressed to the Treasurer of the Territory, shall give the age and place of residence of the applicant, and, if the applicant be a resident of Alaska, it shall state how long he has been such resident immediately preceding the signing of the application.

Contents of Application.

The application shall also state whether the applicant is a native born or naturalized citizen, and, if foreign born, whether or not he has declared his intention to become a citizen of the United States. If he

be a naturalized citizen the application shall state where and when he became a citizen, and if he has declared his intention to become a citizen the application shall state where and when such intention was declared; provided, however, that this requirement shall not apply to one who is native descendant of one of the aboriginal tribes of Alaska and who in the application describes himself as such.

Treasurer to furnish blanks and make regulations.

Section 3. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer of the Territory to prepare blank forms for applications for licenses under this Act, and he may promulgate rules and regulations for carrying out the provisions of this Act.

Statement to be sworn to.

Section 4. The statements in the application shall by the applicant, be verified under oath as true before some officer authorized to administer the oath. Anyone knowingly swearing falsely to any statement in such application, or anyone procuring or having in his possession a license issued by reason of any false or fraudulent statement in any application for a license, shall be deemed guilty of a felony, and, upon conviction, shall be punished by imprisonment in the jail for a period of not more than 30 days or by a fine of not more than one hundred (\$100.00) dollars, or by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the court.

Penalty for false statement.

Section 5. The term "fishing" as used in this act means the catching of fish, whether by hook, net, or seine.

By the term "fisherman" as used in this Act is meant anyone engaged in "fishing" as above interpreted.

Definition of terms.

The term "resident" fisherman used in this Act shall mean one who at the time of applying for a license shall be a bona fide resident of the Territory of Alaska and shall have been such resident continuously for at least six months immediately preceding the signing of such application.

The term "non-resident" fisherman as used in this Act shall mean one who is not a "resident" fisherman as above interpreted.

Section 6. The license herein provided for shall be exhibited, upon demand therefor, to any officer, agent or employee of the Federal or Territorial government.

License to be open to inspection.

Section 7. It shall be unlawful for any person, association or corporation, or for the agent of any person, or for the officer or agent of any association or corporation, to knowingly have in his, their, or its employ, or to knowingly purchase fish from, any fisherman who is not duly licensed as such under the provisions of this Act.

Unlawful to employ, or purchase fish from unlicensed fishermen.

Anyone violating any of the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine of not more than two hundred (\$200.00) dollars, or by imprisonment for not more than thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the court, and in addition thereto shall pay to the Territory double the license tax provided by this Act and which such fisherman was required to pay to secure a license from the Territory.

Penalty for violation.

Section 8. This Act shall not apply to fishing for personal consumption but shall apply only to fishing for commercial purposes.

Act to apply only to commercial fishing.

Section 9. No license herein provided for shall be valid beyond the calendar year in which it was issued and shall expire on the 31st day of December next after the date on which it was issued.

License valid only for calendar year.

Section 10. The Territorial Treasurer is hereby authorized to appoint the United States Commissioners of the several precincts of the Territory or any other persons as his agents to take applications, issue the licenses and collect the license fees herein provided for. The said commissioners or other agents of the Treas-

urer shall receive for their services fifty (50) cents for each resident fisherman's license so issued, and a fee of seventy-five (75) cents for each non-resident fisherman's license so issued. The commissioners or other agents of the Treasurer shall monthly transmit to the Treasurer all fees so collected by them together with a full account of the same.

The Treasurer shall not be liable for the defalcation or failure to account for the fees so collected by any commissioner or other agent so appointed.

Section 11. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after the first day of January, 1924.

## CHAPTER 95.

### AN ACT

[H. B. 49]

To supplement the fish laws of the United States applicable to Alaska; to conserve the salmon supply of Alaska; to provide for closed seasons for salmon fishing, and for other purposes, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful to take or fish for salmon for commercial purposes, except by trollers, in the waters of Alaska between the 57th and 60th degrees of north latitude and east of 139th meridian west longitude from the tenth day of August to the first day of September in each year.

Two closed salmon seasons in Alaska, except for trollers, dates depending on location.

Section 2. That it shall be unlawful to take or fish for salmon for commercial purposes, except by trollers, in the waters of Alaska south of the 57th degree of north latitude and east of 139th meridian from the 20th day of August to the 9th day of September in each year.
