

CHAPTER 96.

AN ACT

[H. B. 59]

To make appropriation for the expenses of the Territory of Alaska for the last three quarters of the fiscal year 1923, beginning April 1 and ending December 31, for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1924, and for the quarter ending March 31, 1925, and for the school year ending June 30, 1925; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. The following sums, or so much thereof as shall be found necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury of the Territory of Alaska not otherwise appropriated, for the expenses of the Territory for the last three quarters of the fiscal year 1923, beginning April 1 and ending December 31, for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1924, and for the quarter ending March 31, 1925, except that the appropriation herein made for support of schools in incorporated towns and incorporated school districts, as well as for support of schools outside of incorporated towns and incorporated school districts, shall be used for expenses during the period from July 1, 1923 to June 30, 1925.
