HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 14.

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska, the Senate concurring, that the Alaska Fish Commission be, and hereby is, instructed to prepare and submit to the next session of the Legislature a report on the following subjects:

1. The amount of salmon of each species taken from or near each stream, as near as can be ascertained, for the years 1919 to 1924, inclusive.

2. The number and location of the various fish traps and the distance of each from the nearest salmon stream.

3. The number of seines and nets used in the waters appurtenant to such streams, as near as can be ascertained.

4. The location of the cannery or canneries to which the salmon from the various localities are taken.

5. The streams in which salmon eggs in the eye state have been deposited or salmon fry released each year by the Territory and by Federal and private hatcheries and the quantity thereof.

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 15.

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring, that for the purpose of carrying out the intention of House Bill No. 49, the Attorney General of the Territory of Alaska is hereby instructed to bring one action, only, and to carry and to prosecute same through the Courts for the purpose of determining the validity of said act; and reporting the outcome of same to the 1925 Session of the Territorial Legislature.
