TO THE SECRETARY OF AGRICULTURE:

WHEREAS, the wild life of the Territory of Alaska is of great importance as a resource to Alaska, the nation and the world at large, and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that Alaska school children, other Alaskans, and people outside of Alaska have facilities for familiarizing themselves with the kinds of valuable and interesting wild life of the Territory, and

WHEREAS, there is at present no publication accessible to the general public, and embodying in a single volume information intelligible to the layman as a guide to a study of the wild life and its economic importance,

THEREFORE, your Memorialists request that the Secretary of Agriculture have prepared and published a bulletin covering the wild life of Alaska in popular vein that can be used in the schools of the Territory as well as for general use.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy hereof be sent to the Secretary of Agriculture and the Delegate to Congress.
