TO THE ALASKA ENGINEERING COMMISSION:

Your memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of the Territory of Alaska, respectfully call your attention to the antiquated system of coupling the cars operated on the narrow-gage [gauge] railroad under the control of the Alaskan Engineering Commission, and the hazard to life and limb of the employees of the railroad, resulting from the use of the antiquated type of couplers;
