

Senate Concurrent Resolutions

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 1.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate and the House of Representatives concurring, that a joint session of the Senate and the House of said Legislature of the Territory of Alaska be held in the hall of the House at two o'clock on the afternoon of Wednesday, the 7th day of March, A. D. 1923, for the purpose of receiving the message of the Governor of the Territory of Alaska.

Passed by the Senate, March 6, 1923.

Passed by the House, March 7, 1923.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 2.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate and the House of Representatives concurring, that the Commissioner of Education be, and he is hereby instructed to call for bids for the printing of 1,000 copies of the Report of the Commissioner of Education;

That under the joint direction of the Finance Committee of the Senate and the Printing and Purchasing Committee of the House, he award the contract for such printing to the lowest and best bidder, and that he have general supervision of the printing and proof reading.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate and House concurring that:

WHEREAS, the custom of former Legislatures has been to appoint a joint committee of the two houses to visit and investigate the home of infirm Pioneers, at the Pioneers' Home, at Sitka, Alaska; and,

WHEREAS, it is necessary in order to talk with the inmates and learn of conditions first hand in order to have complete information and data for intelligent action by the Legislature—

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate, the House concurring, that a joint committee consisting of three members

from the Senate and five members from the House be appointed to visit the Pioneers' Home at Sitka during the present session of the Legislature and submit a report together with recommendations, to improve conditions at the Home.

BE IT RESOLVED, that said committee shall be authorized, if necessary, to hold hearings, summon witnesses, administer oaths to witnesses and take their testimony, as provided in Chapter 6 Laws of 1917;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Governor of the Territory of Alaska request of the proper officials the use of the United States Steamship Unalga to convey members of the committee to Sitka and return.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 4.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Territory of Alaska, the House of Representatives concurring, that at the hour of three thirty o'clock P. M. on the 19th day of March, 1923, a joint session of the Legislature convene in the hall of the House of Representatives to participate in a program prepared and arranged by the American Legion for the presentation of a distinguished service medal awarded by the Government of the United States for merit to Major J. C. Gotwals of the United States Army, now stationed at Juneau, Alaska.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 5.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate and the House of Representatives concurring, that the Report of the Board of Trustees of the Agricultural College and School of Mines be printed.

That under the joint direction of the Finance Committee of the Senate and the Printing and Purchasing Committee of the House, bids be called for the printing of two hundred and fifty copies of the Report of the Board of Trustees of the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines, and that award of contract for such printing be to the lowest bidder.
