

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 6.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Representatives concurring, that the report of the Labor Commissioner of the Territory of Alaska, be printed;

That under joint direction of the Finance Committee of the Senate and the Printing and Purchasing Committee of the House of Representatives, bids be called for the printing of five hundred (500) copies of the report of said Labor Commissioner of the Territory of Alaska, and that the award of contract for such printing be to the lowest bidder.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 7.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING:

That the Attorney General is instructed to continue his investigations on the subject of transportation and, if in his opinion such course is likely to be productive of good results, to file complaint with the United States Shipping Board and take the necessary steps to submit the case of the people of Alaska in support of such complaint.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 9.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, the House concurring, that a Joint Session of the two Houses be held on the 25th day of April, at 8:00 P. M. as recommended by the Joint Committee on Fisheries, Game and Agriculture, for the purpose of considering House Concurrent Resolution No. 12, introduced by Mr. Grant, and House Bill No. 49 by Mr. Price.

Such action is made necessary by reason of the importance of the two bills, so that full and complete information and knowledge may be obtained in regard to the merits of same.
