

## Senate Joint Resolutions

### SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 1.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska that the Committees of the Senate and House, on Judiciary and Federal Relations, be authorized to expend the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) for the employment of additional clerical help, this to be in addition to the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) provided by House Joint Resolution No. 1.

### SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 3.

WHEREAS, a national and international exhibition in commemoration of the one hundred fiftieth anniversary of American Independence is to be held in the city of Philadelphia in the year 1926; and

WHEREAS, by joint resolution unanimously passed by Congress and signed by the President, Federal sanction and approval have been given to the holding of such celebration and exhibition; and

WHEREAS, Alaska is invited to participate in this memorable and historic event; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, in sixth biennial session assembled, heartily approves the holding of such celebration and exhibition and expresses it as the sense of this body that the Territory should participate therein in a suitable and creditable way.

RESOLVED, further, that the Senate shall designate two of its members and the House four of its members who, with the Governor, shall constitute a Sesqui-Centennial Commission, and, serving without compensation or expense, shall formulate for submission to the Territorial Legislature of 1925 necessary plans for the proper participation of Alaska in said celebration and exhibition.
