CHAPTER 10.

AN ACT

[H. B. 33]

To amend Section 10 of Chapter 29, Session Laws of 1919, as amended by Section 2 of Chapter 19, Laws of 1921, and Section 14 of Chapter 29, Laws of 1919, the same being "An Act to impose a tax upon male persons in the Territory of Alaska for school purposes," approved May 1, 1919; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 10 of Chapter 29 of the Laws of 1919, as amended by Section 2 of Chapter 19, Laws of 1921, be, and it is hereby, amended to read as follows:

"Section 10. The Treasurer of the Territory of Alaska shall, before the first Monday in the month of April in each year deliver to the Clerk of each incorporated city and to the Clerk of each School Board in the school districts outside incorporated cities, or to the tax collector appointed by the Governor, where such appointment is made, blank tax receipts, in book form, with stubs numbered the same as the receipts, of one hundred (100) in each book and in sufficient number for each school district and city, and who shall deliver such

receipt books to the tax collector within their respective districts and take his receipt therefor, which receipt shall be promptly transmitted to the Treasurer of the Territory. The unused receipts, together with the stubs of the used receipts, shall be returned to the Treasurer of the Territory by each tax collector before the thirty-first day of December in the year in which they were delivered. It shall be presumed that the tax collector has collected a tax for each receipt not so returned."

Unused receipts to be returned.

Section 2. That Section 14 of Chapter 29 of the Laws of 1919, be, and the same is hereby, amended to read as follows:

"Section 14. The Governor of Alaska shall have the power to appoint a person to act as School Tax Collector, where necessary, in any portion of the Territory of Alaska, except within the limits of any incorporated town, where, in his judgment, it would serve the interests of the Territory better than to have a collector in each school district, it being the intent of this act, so far as possible, that the taxes imposed by the laws of Alaska be collected by agents under salary rather than agents on commission. This shall not be construed to prevent the appointment of a Tax Collection Clerk, in which case no additional compensation shall be allowed. Such person shall furnish a bond as required by this Act of other School Tax Collectors, which bond shall be approved by the nearest United States Commissioner and filed with the Territorial Treasurer, and all of the provisions of this Act shall apply to the School Tax Collector so appointed."

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 11.

AN ACT

[H. B. 37]

For the return of over-paid tax money to the Deep Sea Salmon Company, a corporation.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

That the sum of Six Hundred Ninety-nine Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$699.50) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the Territory for the benefit of the Deep Sea Salmon Company, a corporation, as a refund for license taxes paid by the said corporation to the Territory, under a mistake, for the year 1922, and the Treasurer of the Territory is authorized to pay said sum to the said corporation.

CHAPTER 12.

AN ACT

[Com. Substitute for H. B. 15]

To provide for the examination of persons charged with being insane by physicians or surgeons and requiring such examining physicians or surgeons to testify at the trial of such persons; providing that such persons shall be entitled to counsel; providing for the postponement of trial whenever necessary, and for changing the place of trial.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That whenever any person within the Territory of Alaska is taken into custody, charged
