## CHAPTER 29.

### AN ACT

[H. B. 44]

To amend Section 1829 Compiled Laws of Alaska to provide for oral notice of appeal in civil cases from Justice Court.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That Section 1829 Compiled Laws of Alaska is hereby amended by adding thereto the following:

“Provided that service and filing of a written notice of appeal may be dispensed with if at the time the decision is rendered or the judgment is entered the aggrieved party gives oral notice in open Court, when the adverse party is present, that he appeals to the District Court from the judgment of the Justice Court. Such notice so given shall be entered upon the docket of the Justice Court, and to

## CHAPTER 30.

### AN ACT

[H. B. 46]

To amend Sections 5 and 6 of Chapter 64, Alaska Session Laws, 1917, being an Act entitled, 'An Act to establish a uniform school system in the Territory of Alaska, to create a Territorial Board of Education and Commissioner of Education, prescribing their powers and duties, and fixing their compensation', and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That Sections 5 and 6 of Chapter 64 of the Session Laws of Alaska of 1917, are hereby amended to read as follows:

“Section 5. The Territorial Board of Education shall have power, and it shall be its duty to appoint at a salary of not to exceed Five Thousand (\$5,000) Dollars per annum, a Commissioner of Education, and upon recommendation of said Commissioner of Education, may appoint such specialists, clerks and other executive office employees as in its judgment are necessary to the efficient conduct of the work of the office of the Commissioner of Education, and fix their salaries.

Section 6. Said Commissioner of Education shall be chosen for a term of two years upon merit, said term to begin on July 1st of each odd-numbered year, and because of his special fitness to propose and execute beneficial educa-
