

hereby appropriated for the purpose of assisting the City of Haines in paying off the indebtedness caused by the construction of a schoolhouse.

Section 2. The sum appropriated in Section 1 of this Act shall be expended under the direction of the Commissioner of Education, and shall be paid by the Treasurer of the Territory upon warrants drawn upon the Treasurer by the Commissioner of Education, specifying the purpose for which such warrants are drawn. Such warrants shall be payable to the Treasurer of the School Board of the City of Haines.

Section 3. The monies appropriated by Section 1 of this Act shall become available for the purposes herein stated whenever the City Council of the City of Haines shall have appropriated for the purpose of paying off the indebtedness against the schoolhouse in said City, a sum equal to the amount hereby appropriated and an additional amount sufficient to pay off the remainder of the indebtedness; it being the intention of this Act that the Territory shall pay off one-half of the indebtedness not to exceed the sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) upon condition that the City of Haines shall pay the entire remainder.

CHAPTER 39.

AN ACT

[H. B. 80.]

To amend Chapter 62 of the Session Laws of 1917, entitled "An Act for the Establishment of the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines in accordance with the provisions of the Act of Congress approved March 4th, 1915, and to grant a Charter to the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines," as amended by Chapter 88 of the Alaska Session Laws of 1923.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 3 of Chapter 88 of the Session Laws of Alaska, 1923, be, and the same hereby is, amended to read as follows:

"Section 3. Be it further enacted that the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines shall hold all property herein granted to it and all property hereafter acquired by it, and that the Treasurer of the Territory of Alaska shall be ex officio Treasurer of the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines, and shall establish a fund in the Treasury of the Territory of Alaska to be known as the "Agricultural College Fund," and shall deposit all monies now held or hereafter acquired by the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines in said "Agricultural College Fund," and shall disburse the same on requisition by the Board of Trustees of said College duly signed by the President and Secretary thereof. And said money so requisitioned shall be paid to the Treasurer of said College, to be by him disbursed on properly drawn vouchers signed by the President and Secretary of the Board of Trustees of said College, and a duplicate copy of said vouchers shall be sent by the President of said College to the Territorial Treasurer, which shall be mailed within six days after the end of each calendar month. The Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines shall use the property and funds herein specified for the purpose of conducting a college where the leading object shall be, without excluding other scientific and classical studies and including military tactics, to teach such branches of learning as are related to agriculture, the mechanic arts and household economics, in order to promote a

liberal and practical education. All departments of said institution shall be open to both sexes for equal educational opportunities. The said Trustees are hereby empowered to conduct a college extension service, the leading object of which shall be to carry information on rural life subjects to the people of Alaska.

CHAPTER 40.

AN ACT

[H. B. 68.]

To amend Chapter 17 of the 1917 Session Laws of Alaska, entitled, "An Act to provide for the erection of cabins and shelter along traveled roads and trails and the equipment of such cabins, making it a crime to remove such cabin or any portions thereof, or any articles contained therein, and prescribing the penalty for such offense."

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 4 of Chapter 17, 1917 Session Laws of Alaska be amended to read as follows:

"The cabins, stoves and other furnishings provided for in this Act shall be the property of the Territory of Alaska, and any person who shall wilfully remove, destroy or deface any such cabin or part thereof, or any stove or other furnishings contained therein, or pertinent thereto, or who shall occupy such cabin for any length of time other than that necessary and incident to ordinary travel along the trail or road where such cabin is situated, shall be deemed guilty of violation of this Act and upon conviction thereof shall be punished
