

by a fine of not less than One Hundred Dollars nor more than Five Hundred Dollars or by imprisonment in the federal jail for not less than three months nor more than one year, or both fine and imprisonment.

Provided further that nothing in this Act shall be construed so as to prevent the Chairman of a Divisional Road Commission from authorizing responsible persons in writing to occupy permanently in the capacity of Caretakers or Roadhouse Keepers such shelters as have adequate accommodations so as to better the accommodations for the traveling public.

Chairman of Divisional Road Commission may appoint caretakers when.

CHAPTER 41.
AN ACT

[H. B. 59.]

Making an appropriation for the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That there is hereby appropriated from the Treasury of the Territory of Alaska the sum of One Hundred Sixty-three Thousand Three Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$163,360.00) to the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines to be expended by such corporation in the maintenance, construction of necessary buildings, making of permanent improvements, and conduct of the College established by Chapter Sixty-two, (62) of the Session Laws of Alaska, 1917, during the school years of 1925-1926 and 1926-1927.

Appropriation.

Section 2. That out of the sum hereby appropriated One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand One Hundred Thir-

ty Dollars (\$125,130.00) thereof shall be turned over to the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines whenever requested by the Board of Trustees of said corporation during the fiscal year 1925-1926, and the sum of Thirty-eight Thousand Two Hundred Thirty Dollars (\$38,230.00) during the fiscal year 1926-1927; Provided further, that none of the moneys hereby appropriated shall be expended to purchase any land or lands.

Limitation of

Section 3. That during the period covered by the school years 1925-1926 and 1926-1927, no indebtedness or obligation shall be incurred by said Agricultural College and School of Mines over and above the amount appropriated and provided for by this Act.

Emergency.

Section 4. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 42.

AN ACT

[H. B. 17.]

To provide liens for wages earned by watchmen of property.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Lien for

Section 1. Any person employed as watchman for any property whether real or personal, shall have a lien upon such property for the wages or salary earned by him as such watchman for such property. Such lien shall be coordinate with any lien for labor or material to which the property is subject. Provided, however, that such lien shall not extend to moneys due for services rendered more than one year prior to the date
