

(\$500.00) Dollars, to reimburse the Hudson Stuck Memorial Hospital at Fort Yukon, Alaska, for surgical and medical attention and hospital care given and rendered to Adolph Biederman under the circumstances mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Treasurer authorized to pay amounts on presentation of vouchers.

Section 3. The Treasurer of the Territory of Alaska is hereby authorized to pay the amounts hereinabove specified to the said Thomas P. McLain and to the Hudson Stuck Memorial Hospital on presentation of vouchers properly executed and approved by the Governor of the Territory.

Emergency.

Section 4. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 51.

AN ACT

[H. B. 62]

To provide for stocking of public lands in the Territory of Alaska with certain valuable game and fur-bearing animals which do not already frequent such lands, providing for the protection of such animals, making an appropriation to carry out the provisions hereof, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Program for stocking certain lands with game and fur bearing animals.

Section 1. There is hereby adopted a program of stocking lands in the Territory of Alaska with valuable game and fur-bearing animals which do not at present occur on such lands, which program shall be divided into the following projects:—

1. Roosevelt Elk to Kenai Peninsula, Hinchinbrook and Kruzof Islands, and the Kodiak-Afognak Island Group.

2. Muskrats to Kodiak-Afognak group.
3. Beaver to Baranof and Chichagof Islands.
4. Beaver to Afognak and northeast portion of Kodiak Island.
5. Deer to Kodiak-Afognak Island group.
6. Mink to Kodiak-Afognak Island group.
7. Marten to Prince of Wales Island group, and to Zarembo Island.
8. Marten to Prince William Sound Islands.
9. Beaver to Yakutat Coastal Plain Region, including Lituya Bay.
10. Marten to Afognak and northeast portion of Kodiak Island.
11. Muskrats to portions of Southeastern Alaska.
12. Beaver to the Chilkat Valley.
13. Varying Hares to Southeastern Alaska.
14. Moose to Kodiak-Afognak Island group.
15. Beaver to Zarembo Island.
16. Varying Hares to the Kodiak-Afognak Island group.
17. Marten to Baronoff and Chichagof Islands.
18. Red Squirrels to Zarembo, Admiralty, Baranof and Chichagof Islands, and to the Prince of Wales Island group, including the Sitka Park.
19. Red Squirrels to Afognak and northeast portion of Kodiak Islands.
20. Varying Hares to Prince William Sound Islands.
21. Mountain Goats to Prince William Sound Islands.

22. Mountain Goats to Southeastern Alaska Islands.

Program to be carried out by Alaska Game Commission.

Section 2. The Alaska Game Commission is hereby authorized and it shall be their duty to carry out said projects by obtaining the necessary animals and placing them on the lands designated in the several projects; Provided, that the projects shall be undertaken in such an order as seems best to the Alaska Game Commission, and that not more than four such projects shall be under way at any one time.

Appropriation.

Section 3. The sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) is hereby appropriated out of the General Fund in the Territorial Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of this Act, and shall be available upon the approval of this Act until expended. All funds disbursed under the provisions of this Act shall be disbursed by the Alaska Game Commission, upon the approval of the Governor of Alaska.

Funds to be disbursed by Alaska Game Commission upon approval Governor.

Animals to be property of Territory.

Section 4. The game and fur bearing animals introduced and liberated under the provisions of this Act shall be the property of the Territory of Alaska and it shall be unlawful for any person to take or to attempt to take, capture, kill, possess, or transport the same or their offspring at any time within five years after the passage and approval of this Act. And any person violating any of the provisions hereof shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars, nor more than Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars, or by imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.

Misdemeanor to capture, kill or dispose of within 5 yrs. from approval act.

Penalty.

Emergency.

Section 5. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
