CHAPTER 57.

AN ACT

[S. B. 31]

To amend Chapter 94 of the Laws of 1923 relative to licensing fishermen, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Section 2 of Chapter 94 of the Laws of 1923 is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

“Section 2. Licenses to fish in the waters of Alaska shall be issued by the Treasurer of the Territory and by such other persons as shall by the Treasurer be deputized for that purpose. Provided, that there may be a deputy appointed in every incorporated city on the coast of Alaska with power to administer oaths to applicants; and, provided further, that there may be two itinerant deputies for each of the First and Third Divisions with like power to administer oaths. Such deputies shall also have power to make arrests and enforce compliance with this Act. Itinerant deputies shall each be supplied with a badge of office constructed of metal with the words “Fish Tax Collector” engraved thereon and which badge they shall wear plainly exposed when on duty.

Treasurer or Deputy to issue fishing license.

Deputies shall have power to arrest.

Badge of deputy.

The license fee shall be as follows:

- (a) For resident fishermen of all classes \$1.00;
- (b) For nonresident fishermen who use any fishing appliance except seines, \$10.00;
- (c) For nonresident fishermen who use seines, \$25.00.

Such fee shall be paid before the license is granted or issued and shall accompany the application for license.

The application for license shall be addressed to the Treasurer of the Territory, shall give the age and place of residence of the applicant, and, if the applicant be a resident of Alaska, it shall state how long he has been such resident immediately preceding the signing of the application.

The application shall also state whether the applicant is a native born or naturalized citizen; and, if foreign born, whether or not he has declared his intention to become a citizen of the United States. If he be a naturalized citizen the application shall state where and when he became a citizen, and if he has declared his intention to become a citizen the application shall state where and when such intention was declared; provided, however, that this requirement shall not apply to one who is native descendant of one of the aboriginal tribes of Alaska and who in the application describes himself as such."

Section 2. That Section 10 of Chapter 94 of the Laws of 1923 is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Contents of application for license.

Treasurer to appoint agents.

“Section 10. The Territorial Treasurer is hereby authorized to appoint the United States Commissioners of the several precincts of the Territory or any other persons as his agents to take applications, issue the licenses and collect the license fees herein provided for. The said Commissioners or other agents of the Treasurer shall receive for their services Fifty (50) Cents for each resident fishermen’s license so issued and a fee of One Dollar and Fifty Cents (\$1.50) for each nonresident fishermen’s license so issued. The Commissioners or other agents of the Treasurer shall monthly transmit to the Treasurer all fees so collected by them together with a full account of the same.

Fee for issuing license.

Monthly accounting by agents.

The Treasurer shall not be liable for the defalcation or failure to account for the fees so collected by any Commissioner or other agent so appointed.”

Treasurer not liable for agents’ collections.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect upon its passage and approval by the Governor.

CHAPTER 58.

AN ACT

[S. B. 28]

Fixing the place of trials for prosecutions for crimes or offenses in the Territory of Alaska and repealing all Acts or parts of Acts in conflict therewith.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Prosecutions for crime to be in Division where same committed.

Section 1. That all prosecutions for crimes or offenses within the District of Alaska shall be had within
