CHAPTER 9.

AN ACT

[H. B. 19]

To appropriate funds for the erection and construction of a school house at Kenai, Alaska, making provision for the construction of such school house, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Appropriation for school house at Kenai. Supplementing sum now authorized to be expended by Commissioner of Education for school building.

Section 1. The sum of Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the Treasury of the Territory of Alaska not otherwise appropriated, for the erection and construction of a public school house at and in the village of Kenai, Alaska. The sum hereby appropriated is in addition to the sum now permitted by existing law to be expended by the Commissioner of Education of the Territory of Alaska, with the approval of the Governor as Chairman of the Territorial Board of Education, for the construction and equipment of school houses in districts outside of incorporated towns, as provided in Chapter 60 of the Session Laws of Alaska of the year 1923.

Under whose direction expended.

Section 2. The sum by this Act appropriated shall be expended under the direction of the Commissioner of Education, and shall be paid by the Treasurer of

the Territory of Alaska upon warrants drawn upon the Treasurer by said Commissioner of Education, specifying the purpose for which such warrants are drawn.

Section 3. The Commissioner of Education is hereby authorized to cause such school house to be constructed under contract, to cause plans for such school building to be drawn, to advertise for bids, to reject or to award the contract to the person submitting the lowest and best bid, and to make, on behalf of the Territory, proper contract or contracts, for the erection, construction and equipment of such school house, and designate the location thereof and the character of construction and equipment. That there shall be not less than two bona fide bidders, each of whom shall submit his bid, together with a good and sufficient bond in an amount equal to fifty (50) per cent of the amount of the bid, which bond shall be conditioned that the said bidder shall enter into and carry out the provisions of the contract for which he bid. Proper bonds shall be required of all contractors, for the faithful carrying out of all contracts, all such bonds to run to and in favor of the Territory. Partial payments may be made from time to time to the contractors, in the discretion of the Commissioner, but not more than sixty per cent of the contract price may be paid before the completion and acceptance of the school house, and its equipment if any, by the Commissioner. The date of acceptance shall not be less than fifty (50) days from the date of completion given by the contractor, which notice shall be under oath, to the effect that the contract had been completed, and that all claims of every kind and nature have been paid.

Section 4.. No part of the sum hereby appropriated, or of any other Territorial moneys, may be used for purchase, rental or acquisition of the grounds on which such school house is built, and such ground must be

Section 5. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 10.

AN ACT

[H. B. 33]

To amend Section 10 of Chapter 29, Session Laws of 1919, as amended by Section 2 of Chapter 19, Laws of 1921, and Section 14 of Chapter 29, Laws of 1919, the same being "An Act to impose a tax upon male persons in the Territory of Alaska for school purposes," approved May 1, 1919; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 10 of Chapter 29 of the Laws of 1919, as amended by Section 2 of Chapter 19, Laws of 1921, be, and it is hereby, amended to read as follows:

"Section 10. The Treasurer of the Territory of Alaska shall, before the first Monday in the month of April in each year deliver to the Clerk of each incorporated city and to the Clerk of each School Board in the school districts outside incorporated cities, or to the tax collector appointed by the Governor, where such appointment is made, blank tax receipts, in book form, with stubs numbered the same as the receipts, of one hundred (100) in each book and in sufficient number for each school district and city, and who shall deliver such
