
House Concurrent Resolutions

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 1.

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, the Senate concurring, that having full confidence in the integrity, ability, and broad vision of President Calvin Coolidge, Vice-President Charles G. Dawes, and the Congress of the United States, and in their high ideals of American government, this body, upon the occasion of National Inauguration Day, pledges them their loyal support, sympathy and understanding in the administration of Alaskan affairs, and expresses the hope that their administration may be successful and may bring peace and prosperity to the Nation.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body, acting in this on behalf of the people of the Territory of Alaska, respectfully tender to the President and Vice-President of the United States, the members of the Cabinet and the Congress of the United States, a cordial invitation to visit Alaska, meet the people thereof, gain first hand information as to the solution of the vast problems now confronting us, and become better acquainted with Alaska and her people.

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 2.

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring, that the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska requests the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees of the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines, to invite the Honorable Chas. E. Bunnell, President of said institution, to appear at a joint session of the Senate and House of Representatives, and appropriate committees, to present the needs of the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines.
