

### HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3.

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, the Senate concurring, that the Secretary of the Territorial Banking Board be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to cause to be printed five hundred (500) copies of the Report of the Territorial Banking Board for the biennial period ending December 31, 1924, and, when so printed, to distribute the same to the members of the Legislature, the several banks of the Territory, public offices and others interested.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the expenses incurred under the provisions of this resolution shall be paid out of the appropriation for Territorial Banking Board.

### HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 4.

WHEREAS, it has been customary for a Joint Committee of the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Territorial Legislature to visit the Alaska Pioneers' Home, at Sitka, for the purpose of looking into the management thereof and investigating the needs of the institution; and,

WHEREAS, it is necessary and proper that such a visit be made during this session for the purposes hereinabove set forth;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, the Senate concurring, that a Joint Committee, to consist of three members of the Senate and five members of the House, be appointed to visit the Alaska Pioneers' Home during this, the seventh, session of the Legislature, with instructions to look into the management of the institution and the needs thereof, and to report its findings and recommendations, if any, to both houses of the Legislature, at an early date.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said committee shall be authorized, if necessary, to hold hearings, summon witnesses, administer oaths to such witnesses, and take their testimony, as provided by Chapter 6, Session Laws of Alaska, 1917.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor of the Territory of Alaska be, and he is hereby, requested to secure,

through the proper officials, the use of the U. S. S. "Unalga" for the purpose of transporting the members of the joint committee to Sitka and return.

### HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 5.

WHEREAS, the Governor of Alaska, in his message to the Legislature, recommended that as a fitting tribute to the long service of former Governor John G. Brady an appropriation be made for a memorial stone to mark his resting place in the National Cemetery at Sitka; and,

WHEREAS, a Committee of this Legislature is about to make a visit to the Alaska Pioneers' Home at that place;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, in seventh session assembled, the Senate concurring, that the Special Committee to be appointed to inspect the Alaska Pioneers Home' at Sitka be, and the same is hereby, authorized to investigate and report upon the probable cost and advisability of the erection of a memorial to former Governor John G. Brady, in the National Cemetery at Sitka, Alaska.

### HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 6.

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, the Senate concurring, that the Secretary of the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners for Alaska be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to cause to be printed two hundred (200) copies of the Report of the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners for Alaska for the biennial period ending March 31, 1925, for distribution to members of the Legislature, Territorial officials, and others interested.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the expense incurred under the provisions of this resolution shall be paid out of the funds appropriated for the use of the said Board.
