

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 7.

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, the Senate concurring, that the Chairman of the Committee on Judiciary and Federal Relations of the House of Representatives be, and he is hereby, authorized to expend not to exceed the sum of Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars in employing a Clerk to the said Committee, and the Committee on Ways and Means of the House is hereby directed to include this item in the General Appropriation Bill.

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 8.

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, the Senate concurring, that the Chairman of the Committee on Ways and Means of the House of Representatives be, and he is hereby, authorized to expend not to exceed the sum of Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars in employing a Clerk to the said Committee and the Committees on Fisheries of the House and Senate, and the Senate Judiciary Committee, and the Committee on Ways and Means of the House is hereby directed to include this item in the General Appropriation Bill.

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 9.

WHEREAS, the daily journal of the House and Senate for April 30, 1925 has not been read or approved, and as the validity of all measures passed by the Legislature on that date depends upon the correct journal entries being made at each stage of their consideration;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the House, the Senate concurring, that the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House in conjunction with the Secretary of the Senate and Chief Clerk of the House, be authorized, after the close of the Session, to revise and arrange said journals in

proper and correct order and sign same, and that said President of the Senate and Speaker of the House be allowed the same salary as they are now receiving, as members of the Legislature, for a period of time not to exceed ten days.
