

That at Nulato, on the Yukon, there are now stationed, as employees of the U. S. Bureau of Education, a physician and a nurse, but the hospital accommodations and living quarters furnished them are in a deplorable condition and consist of one three-bed ward, which is constantly overcrowded, of a living room about eight feet square and a small kitchen; that there is no operating room nor store room, and whenever more than three patients apply for admission, which is frequently the case in the summer, the overflow must be cared for in the living quarters of the staff.

WHEREFORE your memorialist respectfully prays:

(1) That immediate steps be taken, either by the Bureau of Education or the Public Health Service, to take over the hospital building and equipment at Candle and station a physician and nurse at that place;

(2) That a hospital be established at Fortuna Ledge and a physician and nurse assigned to duty there; and,

(3) That the Bureau of Education be authorized to immediately construct suitable hospital buildings and living quarters for the staff at Nulato.

And for the establishment of these necessary aids in order that proper medical and hospital attention be available to the many white and native inhabitants of the country surrounding these places, and that further fatalities, such as heretofore have occurred, may be prevented, your memorialist will ever pray.

BE IT RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be sent by the Secretary of the Territory to the Secretary of the Interior, to the U. S. Commissioner of Education, to the Surgeon General Public Health Service, and to the Hon. Dan Sutherland, Delegate to Congress from Alaska.

## HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 12.

TO THE HONORABLE, THE SECRETARY OF THE  
TREASURY:

We, your memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, respectfully represent that:

WHEREAS, the only protection to shipping in the Bering Sea and Arctic Ocean is that afforded by the patrol maintained by the United States Coast Guard Service in the aforementioned waters; and,

WHEREAS, the greatest danger in the navigation of these waters exists in the late fall and near the close of navigation;

THEREFORE your memorialist respectfully petitions that the said patrol by vessels of the United States Coast Guard Service be maintained in the waters of the Bering Sea and Arctic Ocean until all vessels operating as common carriers in said waters shall have discontinued their operations therein and thus afford them the protection so urgently needed during the most dangerous period of navigation as above stated.

And your memorialist will ever pray.

### HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 13.

TO THE ALASKA ROAD COMMISSION AND THE TERRITORIAL BOARD OF ROAD COMMISSIONERS FOR ALASKA:

Your memorialist, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, most respectfully and earnestly represents:

That it is urgently needed to have the following Postal Mail Trails from Nenana in the Fourth Division of Alaska, over the regular established mail routes, repaired and completed in order to permit the safe and speedy transportation of the mails in that section of Alaska:

(a) The Postal Mail Trail from Nenana to Campbell's Road House, or some other logical point via the River Route; and,

(b) The Postal Mail Trail from Nenana to Knight's Road House on the McGrath Trail.

WHEREFORE, your memorialist respectfully petitions that the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) be set aside from the funds in the hands of the Commission, for the purpose of completing and repairing the above Postal Mail
