

How expended.

Section 2. The sum by this Act appropriated shall be expended under the direction of the Commissioner of Education, and shall be paid by the Treasurer of the Territory of Alaska upon warrants drawn upon the Treasurer by said Commissioner of Education, specifying the purpose for which such warrants are drawn.

Commissioner to arrange for construction.

Section 3. The Commissioner of Education is hereby authorized to cause plans for such school building to be prepared, to designate the location of such building, provide for the purchase and transportation of the material for such construction and to make such contract for the erection of the building as he finds proper.

Grounds to be furnished without cost to Territory.

Section 4. No part of the sum hereby appropriated, or of any other Territorial moneys, may be used for the purchase, rental or acquisition of the grounds on which such school house is built, and such ground must be furnished to the Territory without cost to the Territory.

Section 5. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately on its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 22.

AN ACT

[H. B. 42]

To reimburse Sitka Lodge No. 1350 of the Loyal Order of Moose, for labor and supplies expended on the Pioneers' Home Cemetery Road, making an appropriation therefor, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. The sum of Four Hundred Dollars (\$400) is hereby appropriated to reimburse the Sitka

Lodge No. 1350 of the Loyal Order of Moose of Sitka, Alaska, for labor and supplies expended on the Pioneers' Home Cemetery Road; and the Treasurer of the Territory is hereby authorized to pay that sum to the said Lodge out of funds not otherwise appropriated.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 23.

AN ACT

[H. B. 9]

To prohibit the malicious burning of lumber or vegetable products, providing a penalty therefor, repealing Section 1915 of the Compiled Laws, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That if any person shall willfully and maliciously burn any pile or parcel of boards or other lumber, timber, or wood; or any stack of hay, grain, or other vegetable product; or any hay, grain, or other vegetable product severed from the soil, but not stacked; or any growing grass or grain, or other growing vegetable product of the soil not his own, such person shall be deemed guilty of a crime, and upon conviction thereof, if the property burned shall exceed in value thirty-five dollars, shall be punished by imprisonment in the penitentiary not less than one nor more than ten years; but if the property burned shall not exceed the value of thirty-five dollars, such person, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by imprisonment in the Federal jail not less than one month nor more than one year, or by fine not less than twenty-five nor more than one hundred dollars, or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court. Penalty.
