Section 3. That the Governor shall cause the original design to be properly encased and placed in the Alaska Historical Museum and that due credit be given to Benny Benson, aged thirteen years, a student in the seventh grade of the Mission Territorial School, near Seward, Alaska, the designer of the flag herein described and adopted as the official flag of Alaska.

CHAPTER 31.

AN ACT

[H. B. 90]

Authorizing the Territorial Treasurer to make refund to Libby, McNeill & Libby, Inc., making an appropriation therefor, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, it appears that Libby, McNeill & Libby, Inc., on November 10, 1924, paid \$200.00 to the Territory for trap license No. 25-005 for the year 1925, covering their trap number 5, and

WHEREAS, the Federal Government later on issued such regulations so that Libby, McNeill & Libby, Inc., could not lawfully construct and operate their trap number 5, and

WHEREAS, equity will recognize the principle that if a trap for which a license is applied for cannot be used because of later Federal regulations, it is fair to refund the license tax,

THEREFORE,

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That the Treasurer of Alaska is hereby authorized to refund to Libby, McNeill & Libby, Inc.,

the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) out of money not otherwise appropriated.

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be effective immediately on its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 32.

AN ACT

[H. B. 83]

To amend Section 1 and 2 of Chapter 51 Session Laws of 1925 entitled, "An Act to provide for stocking public lands in the Territory of Alaska with certain valuable game and fur-bearing animals which do not already frequent such lands, providing for the protection of such animals, making an appropriation to carry out the provisions hereof, and declaring an emergency."

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 1 and 2 of Chapter 51 Session Laws of 1925, be, and hereby is, amended to read as follows:

There is hereby adopted a program of stocking lands in the Territory of Alaska with valuable game and fur-bearing animals which do not at present occur on such lands, which program shall be divided into the following projects:—

1. Roosevelt Elk to Kenai Peninsula, Hinchinbrook and Kruzof Islands, and the Kodiak Afognak Island group.
2. Muskrats to Kodiak-Afognak group.
3. Beaver to Baranof and Chichagof Islands.

Program for stocking lands with game and fur-bearing animals.
