Section 2. The Alaska Game Commission is hereby authorized and it shall be their duty to carry out said projects by obtaining the necessary animals and placing them on the lands designated in the several projects; Provided, that at least one project shall be undertaken in each Division every two years and that otherwise the projects shall be undertaken in such an order as seems best to the Alaska Game Commission and that not more than four projects shall be under way at any one time.

Alaska Game Commission to carry out program.

CHAPTER 33.

AN ACT

[H. B. 69]

To provide for procuring the services of predatory animal trappers for Alaska, to prescribe their duties and appropriate funds for their salaries and expenses.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Governor authorized procure services predatory animal trappers.

Section 1. The Governor is hereby authorized to procure the services of scientifically trained predatory animal trappers or hunters for service in Alaska, to designate their fields of action and otherwise carry

out the provisions of this Act. The Governor is further authorized to enter into an agreement with the Alaska Game Commission or Bureau of Biological Survey, or both, to cooperate with the Territory in carrying out the purpose of this Act.

Section 2. The predatory animal trappers or hunters herein provided for shall be trappers or hunters who have been scientifically trained by the Department of Agriculture for the suppression of predatory animals and who have been employed in such work and are recognized by the said Department as experts. The Governor shall fix the amount of the salaries of such trappers or hunters which shall be in his judgment proper, but such amount shall not be more than Thirty-Six Hundred Dollars (\$3,600.00) per annum. And the Governor shall arrange to pay the actual traveling expenses and also to pay for necessary equipment, supplies and help while in the field.

Section 3. It shall be the duties of such trappers or hunters to attempt to eradicate the wolves and coyotes in Alaska by whatever methods they deem best adapted for the purpose, and it shall be their further duty to give instructions to resident trappers, hunters and game wardens whenever possible.

Section 4. Animals or skins of animals captured or taken by employees of the Territory in the course of predatory animal work under this Act shall be the property of the Territory of Alaska, and shall be sold by the Territory at public auction duly advertised and held in Alaska and the moneys so derived shall be covered into the general funds of the Territory of Alaska. Provided, however, that if, in the judgment of the Governor, that any animal or pelt so coming under the ownership of the Territory, is more valuable for scientific, educational or exhibition purposes than for commercial purposes he may divert the same to

the use or to the safe keeping of any public institution within the Territory.

Appropriation.

Section 5. There is hereby appropriated out of the moneys of the Territorial Treasury not otherwise appropriated the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) or as much thereof as is necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act.

CHAPTER 34.

AN ACT

[H. B. 37]

To appropriate the sum of Seventeen Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$17,200.00), to aid shipping in the Territory of Alaska, along the coast of Seward Peninsula, from St. Michaels to Kotzebue, and for the advertising for bids, repealing Chapter 47, Session Laws of 1923, and Chapter 15, Session Laws of 1925, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Appropriation
for ship
subsidy.

Section 1. That the Governor of Alaska is authorized to pay a sum of money, not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) and not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) in any one year, to the owner or charterer of any ship or vessel of American registry, of a cargo capacity of not less than forty tons under deck and a passenger capacity of not less than twenty (20) persons, and a loaded draft of not to exceed seven (7) feet, and of a maximum speed of not less than eight (8) knots per hour, who shall operate such ship or vessel in the coastwise trade, as a common carrier of freight and passengers from Nome to Kotzebue, touching at Teller, Wales, Shismareff, Deering, Keewalik, and making not less than seven (7) regular stated trips and return not less than once each two (2) weeks during the season when navigation is open in the aforementioned waters under

Nome to
Kotzebue.
