tion 5 of this Act; provided, further, that no incorporated town, city or incorporated school district shall receive more than Thirty Thousand (\$30,000.00) Dollars from the Territory under the provisions of this Act during any one school year of not less than nine school months, and in addition thereto not more than Fifteen Hundred (\$1,500.00) Dollars for the maintenance of a normal high school; and provided further, that no incorporated town, city or incorporated school district shall receive more than an amount equal to 85 per cent of the amount of expenditures as incurred by such incorporated town, city, or incorporated school district during the school year 1926 and 1927; and provided, further, that after the school year ending 1922 no part of any appropriation shall be available for the maintenance of normal high schools, unless a special appropriation is made for that purpose.

Section 2. All Acts or parts of Acts in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 38.

AN ACT

[H. B. 7]

To stimulate interest in agricultural development, animal industry, home economics, mining and manufacturing in the Territory of Alaska, and providing funds for annual fairs within the Territory, and for exhibits to be displayed outside the Territory, prescribing rules governing the same, appropriating money therefor, repealing Chapter 31, Laws of 1925, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Territorial aid
for industrial
fairs.

Section 1. That Agricultural and Industrial Fair Associations, incorporated under the laws of the Territory of Alaska, may receive Territorial aid in con-

ducting and maintaining annual agricultural and industrial fairs as hereinafter provided.

Section 2. Fairs may be held each year in each of the four Judicial Divisions of the Territory, and the Territorial aid to the conduct and maintenance of such fairs shall not exceed the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) annually for each Division; Provided, that the people of each Division shall subscribe and have available for expenditure an equal amount for such purpose, and shall have, or shall organize, an Agricultural and Industrial Fair Association for the conduct and maintenance of such fairs. Provided, further, that each of said fairs shall be open to entries by the people of the whole Territory and that special provisions shall be made for exhibits from Boys' and Girls' Clubs.

Limitation of Territorial aid for each Division.

Proviso.

Section 3. Each Agricultural and Industrial Fair Association desiring to come within the provisions of this Act, shall make application to the Governor of the Territory prior to July 1st of each year, accompanying the same with a full program of the proposed fair to be held, and all rules and regulations governing the same, accompanied by a certificate, signed by the President and Secretary of the Association, that such Association has in its treasury, available for expenditure for such proposed fair, the sum equal to the amount of the benefits requested under this Act, contributed by the people of the Division in which such fair is to be held. When satisfied that the Association is entitled to receive Territorial aid under the provisions of this Act, the Governor shall cause a warrant to be drawn on the Territorial Treasurer, in favor of the said Association, in the sum to which said Association is entitled under the provision of this Act. And the Territorial Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to pay annually, whenever directed by the Governor so to do, the sum so directed by the Governor to be paid under the provisions of this Act. The

Conditions under which aid may be secured.

Treasurer shall require, and each Association receiving Territorial aid hereunder shall furnish, receipts for such moneys, so paid to them, upon such forms as the Treasurer may prescribe, covering the disbursements by said Associations of all Territorial funds, for any and all fairs held under the provisions of this Act. Provided, further, that said Association shall make a full report to the Governor to be transmitted to the next Legislature of receipts and expenditures including the sums expended for prizes and awards.

Governor empowered to ship exhibits out of Territory.

Section 4. The Governor of the Territory is also authorized and empowered to collect and ship, for display outside of the Territory, exhibits of Alaskan produce, mining and manufacturing, and such other exhibits, including the native arts, as he may deem advisable. And he is hereby authorized to expend not to exceed the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) per annum for that purpose. And the Territorial Treasurer shall pay the same upon the presentation of vouchers to be approved by the Governor. The Governor shall account and report for the funds disbursed under the provisions of this section.

Appropriation.

Section 5. There is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the Territorial Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act for the biennium ending March 31, 1929, to be paid out and accounted for as hereinabove provided.

No prohibition against the formation of more than one fair Association in any Division.

Section 6. Nothing in this Act shall prohibit the formation of more than one agricultural and industrial fair Association in each Division or the holding of an agricultural and industrial fair in several places in each Division. Provided, however, that the minimum aid shall be \$250.00 and provided further that when more than one such Association shall apply for the benefits of this Act, the Governor shall divide the money allot-

ted to the Division among the applicants in proportion to the amount on hand and in Treasury of applicants Allotment. at time of application.

Section 7. The Governor may in his discretion require any association to expend not to exceed 10% of Territorial aid granted, for the purpose of buying non-perishable exhibits which shall then be held by the Association subject to the order of the Governor.

Section 8. In the event that any Association that has received Territorial Funds under this Act shall fail to hold fair in accordance to its program such Association shall return such funds to the Territorial Treasurer within sixty days after the date set for such fair. Failure to hold fair Territorial money to be returned to Treasurer. Provided, further, that upon failure of any Association to comply with this section the Attorney General is hereby authorized and instructed to institute proper proceedings to recover such funds.

Section 9. Chapter 31, Laws of 1925, is hereby Repeal. repealed.

Section 10. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 39.

AN ACT

[H. B. 94]

To amend Chapter 99, Session Laws of Alaska, 1923, by adding a new section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Chapter 99 of the Session Laws of 1923 is hereby amended by adding a new section to read as follows:

Section 10. All moneys received by the Secretary under this Act shall be covered into the General Fund of the Territorial Treasury.
