

Alaska Road Commission will provide and operate said Tram, including said extension from the lower end of the Log Jam to the town of Livengood, as required by the River and Harbor Act of the United States Congress, approved January 21, 1927, authorizing the snagging of the Tolovana River below said Log Jam, and appropriating sufficient funds therefor.

Section 3. For the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this Act, there is hereby appropriated from the general funds of the Territory not otherwise appropriated, the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary to make the aforesaid extension, provided, however, that such sum shall come out of the monies allotted to the Fourth Division of Alaska for the construction, repair and maintenance of roads, trails bridges and ferries for the coming biennium.

Section 4. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

## CHAPTER 48.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 36]

Placing a bounty on hair seals, providing payment for the same, requiring the making of certificates as to the killing of hair seals, providing penalties and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That there be and hereby is placed upon every hair seal inhabiting the inland waters and all waters adjacent to the southern coast of Alaska and east of the 152nd meridian, a bounty of \$2.00, said sum to be paid in accordance with the provisions of this Act.

Section 2. To obtain said bounty, any person killing a hair seal within the limits herein prescribed, in Alaska, after the passage of this Act, shall, as soon as possible, exhibit, to any United States Commissioner, United States Postmaster, United States Assistant Postmaster or Notary Public within the Territory of Alaska, so much of the skin (or scalp), taken from the head of said hair seal, intact, as to show the whole face, including both eyeholes and both ears, and shall subscribe to a certificate in substantially the following form:

Section 3. In the presence of the United States Commissioner, United States Postmaster, United States Assistant Postmaster or Notary Public, and after obtaining the United States Commissioner's, United States Postmaster's, United States Assistant Postmaster's or Notary Public's signature to the above certificate, the person making the above certificate shall enclose the same in an envelope which he shall attach to a mailable package containing the scalps exhibited, and mail the same to the Treasurer of the Territory of Alaska, at Juneau, Alaska. Upon receipt of such certificate duly signed and accompanied by the scalps of the hair seal so killed, the Treasurer of Alaska shall forward the amount due to the person so killing said hair seal, and shall then destroy the scalps so exhibited.

Section 4. Any person making a false certificate for the purpose of fraudulently obtaining any money from the Treasurer of the Territory of Alaska under the provisions of this Act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the first offense and not more than two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) for a second or other offense, or be imprisoned for a period of not more than six months for the first offense, and

a period of not more than one year for a second or other offense, or both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the Court.

Section 5. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

## CHAPTER 49.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 27]

Authorizing the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners for Alaska to expend a sum not to exceed Twenty-Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) annually, to be taken from the moneys appropriated for the construction, repair and maintenance of roads, trails and bridges and ferries and which may be allotted to the Second Division of Alaska at this session of the Territorial Legislature for the purpose of paying to the City of Nome, Alaska, the sum of Twenty-Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) annually for the purpose of relieving said City of Nome of its obligation and agreement of December 22, 1917, with the War Department to pay annually the said sum of Twenty-Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) for the maintenance and improvement of the Nome harbor, and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners of Alaska is hereby authorized to expend out of the moneys appropriated at this session of the Territorial Legislature for the construction and maintenance of roads, trails, bridges and ferries in the Territory of Alaska and which may be allotted to the Second Judicial Division of Alaska, the sum of Twenty-Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) annually, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the purpose of paying to the said city of Nome the sum of Twenty-Five
