CHAPTER 60.

AN ACT

[H. B. 97]

To make appropriation for the expenses of the Territory of Alaska for the last three quarters of the fiscal year 1927, beginning April 1 and ending December 31, for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1928, and for the quarter ending March 31, 1929, and for the school year ending June 30, 1929; and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. The following sums or so much thereof as shall be found necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury of the Territory of Alaska not otherwise appropriated for the expenses of the Territory for the last three quarters of the fiscal year 1927, beginning April 1 and ending December 31, for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1928, and for the quarter ending March 31, 1929, except that the appropriation herein made for support of schools in incorporated towns and incorporated school districts, as well as for support of schools outside of incorporated towns and incorporated school districts shall be used for expenses during the period from July 1, 1927, to June 30, 1929.

CHAPTER 61.

AN ACT

[H. B. 95]

To amend Section 24 of Chapter 97 of the Laws of 1923 relative to the power of the Municipal Magistrate, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 24 of Chapter 97 of the Laws of 1923 be amended by adding thereto the following:

“Unless otherwise provided by ordinance a judgment in the Court of the Municipal Magistrate may be enforced in the same manner as judgments in the Justice Court. Executions shall be addressed to the Chief of Police or any police officer of the City, and the levy thereof, as well as all other proceedings thereunder, shall be the same as in the Court of a Justice of the Peace.”

Section 2. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
