## CHAPTER 66.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 14]

To provide that no repeal or amendment of a statute shall work a release or extinguishment of any penalty, forfeiture or liability previously incurred in a civil action, unless so expressly provided by the repealing statute.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

The repeal or amendment of any statute shall not have the effect to release or extinguish any penalty, forfeiture or liability incurred in a civil action under such statute unless the repealing Act shall so expressly provide, and such statute shall be treated as still remaining in force for the purpose of sustaining any proper action or prosecution for the enforcement of such penalty, forfeiture or liability.

Repeal of statute not to relinquish penalty incurred.

## CHAPTER 67.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 29]

To amend Subsection 14th of Section 12 of Chapter 97 of the Laws of 1923 relative to the power and authority of City Councils, as amended by Chapter 66 of the 1925 Session Laws of the Territory of Alaska.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

That subsection 14th of Section 12 of Chapter 97 of the laws of 1923 as amended by Chapter 66 of the 1925 Session Laws of the Territory of Alaska is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

vendors, etc.

“Fourteenth: To license, tax, restrain, or prohibit peddling, hawking on or in the streets of the city or at any public place therein; and the council may impose by ordinance a reasonable license tax on auctioneers, itinerant vendors and persons, their principals and agents, engaged in a temporary or transient business of vending or selling merchandise, stocks or bonds or other articles of commerce within the municipality; but the provisions of this subdivision shall not apply to orders taken by commercial travellers and in the usual course of business or to bona fide sales or [of] merchandise or goods by sample for future delivery.”

## CHAPTER 68.

### AN ACT

[S. B. 69]

To appropriate the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars, to be deducted from the road funds allotted to the Third Judicial Division, for the benefit of the town of Seward, Alaska, to be expended by the Board of Road Commissioners for Alaska in the regulation of Lowell Creek, Alaska, pursuant to the Act of Congress, approved February 9, 1927, under which the Secretary of War is authorized to expend not to exceed the sum of One Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars for the protection of the buildings, terminal grounds, and so forth, of the Alaska Engineering Commission and the Alaska Road Commission, the Department of Justice, the United States Signal Corps and other Federal property, within or adjacent to the town of Seward, Alaska, from damage due to floods and overflows of said Lowell Creek, of which amount the sum of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars is to be contributed by the town of Seward or other local interests, and declaring an emergency.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*
