“Fourteenth: To license, tax, restrain, or prohibit peddling, hawking on or in the streets of the city or at any public place therein; and the council may impose by ordinance a reasonable license tax on auctioneers, itinerant vendors and persons, their principals and agents, engaged in a temporary or transient business of vending or selling merchandise, stocks or bonds or other articles of commerce within the municipality; but the provisions of this subdivision shall not apply to orders taken by commercial travellers and in the usual course of business or to bona fide sales or [of] merchandise or goods by sample for future delivery.”

CHAPTER 68.

AN ACT

[S. B. 69]

To appropriate the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars, to be deducted from the road funds allotted to the Third Judicial Division, for the benefit of the town of Seward, Alaska, to be expended by the Board of Road Commissioners for Alaska in the regulation of Lowell Creek, Alaska, pursuant to the Act of Congress, approved February 9, 1927, under which the Secretary of War is authorized to expend not to exceed the sum of One Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars for the protection of the buildings, terminal grounds, and so forth, of the Alaska Engineering Commission and the Alaska Road Commission, the Department of Justice, the United States Signal Corps and other Federal property, within or adjacent to the town of Seward, Alaska, from damage due to floods and overflows of said Lowell Creek, of which amount the sum of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars is to be contributed by the town of Seward or other local interests, and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Appropriation

Section 1. That there is hereby appropriated for the benefit of the town of Seward, Alaska, to be

deducted from the road funds, which may be appropriated at the present session of this Legislature and allotted to the Third Judicial Division, the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars to be expended by the Board of Road Commissioners for Alaska, pursuant to the Act of Congress, approved February 9, 1927, under which the Secretary of War is authorized to expend not to exceed One Hundred Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars for the regulation of Lowell Creek, Alaska, for the protection of buildings, terminal grounds, and so forth, of the Alaska Engineering Commission and the Alaska Road Commission, the Department of Justice, the United States Signal Corps and other federal property within and adjacent to the town of Seward, Alaska from damage due to floods and overflows of said Lowell Creek, of which amount the sum of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars is to be contributed by the town of Seward of [or] other local interests, to be benefited by the proposed improvement.

Section 2. That the Treasurer of the Territory of Alaska is hereby authorized to pay to the Disbursing Officer of the Board of Road Commissioners for Alaska as requested, the amount of money hereby appropriated or so much thereof as may be needed.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared and this Act shall be in force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.
