

Now, Therefore;

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Cooperation
restoring water
transportation
in Iditarod,
by whom.

Section 1. The Alaska Road Commission, with the consent and approval of the Territorial Board of Road Commissioners, is hereby authorized and empowered to take such steps as may be deemed necessary to restore proper water transportation to the Town of Iditarod.

Appropriation
from Road Fund
4th Division.

Section 2. The sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary is hereby appropriated out of the monies appropriated at this session of the Legislature for the construction and maintenance of roads, trails, bridges and ferries which may be allotted to the Fourth Judicial Division of Alaska, for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this Act.

Emergency.

Section 3. An emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 103.

AN ACT

[H. B. 82]

For the protection of minor children and prescribing a penalty for contributing to their delinquency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Punishment
contributing to
dependency or
delinquency
minor.

Section 1. The parent or parents, legal guardian or person having the custody of any minor under the age of eighteen (18) years, or any other person, who, shall by any act or omission, encourage, cause or contribute to the dependency or delinquency of such child shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding One

Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00) Dollars, or imprisonment in jail for not more than one year, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Provided, however, that the court may suspend sentence for a violation of the provisions of this Act and impose conditions as to conduct in the premises of any person so convicted, and make suspension to depend upon the fulfilment by such person of such conditions, and in case of the breach of such conditions, or any thereof, the court may impose sentence as though there had been no suspension.

CHAPTER 104.

AN ACT

[S. B. 63]

To make an appropriation for scholarships for certain high school graduates in the Territory, to attend the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That the high school student in each graduating class in the several high schools of the Territory who, upon the completion of four years of high school work in the high schools of the Territory, obtained the highest average standing for all the credits earned, and who graduated at the annual commencements in 1929 and 1930, is hereby entitled to receive during dormitory residence at the Alaska Agricultural College and School of Mines a scholarship covering dormitory rent for a period of two years, next succeeding the year of graduation, upon presenting to the Registrar of the College a certificate signed by the Superintendent of the high school from which such student is graduated stating that the graduate therein named is entitled to receive the benefits of the scholarship herein provided.
